On March 31, the Fisherman's Friend in Lodi will have a Kokanee Salmon fishing seminar including discussions by fishing guides, and displays of fishing tackle. Car pools will be formed at the next fishing meeting on March 22. A two-day fishing seminar is scheduled for April 28 and 29 by Glory Hole Sports in Angels Camp. No one showed interest in attending at the last fishing meeting but the seminar is open to the public.

Trout fishing May 4-6 at McSwain Reservoir is the first scheduled fishing trip. Campsites have been reserved and most are already taken. ### Health Matters Physical and Mental



More Accurate than Cholesterol Discuss it with your doctor & lab There's a new blood test that researchers say is the most accurate way yet of forecasting the risk of

heart disease. It may one day replace the standard cholesterol readings. It's called hs-CRP (which stands for high-sensitivity C reactive protein).

It measures the inflammation of blood vessels. A high CRP indicates inflammation in the vessels which can prompt hardened plaque on vessel walls to break off, leading to a heart attack or stroke.

In studies of 28,000+ women over a three year period, the *New England Journal of Medicine* (March 23, 2000) reports that the test can help avoid problems that would otherwise go undetected.


