

Escalloped Asparagus Mother's tried and true recipe.

1 can asparagus (white)

Juice of asparagus and enough milk to make 1-1/2 to 2 cups total.

1/3 cup butter, 1/4 cup flour, 3/4 cup grated American cheese.

Pour off excess juice of asparagus into measuring cup. Add enough milk to measure 1-1/2 to 2 cups of liquid. Place drained asparagus in casserole.

melt butter, add flour, heat together until smooth. Add the liquid, stirring until thick. Add cheese. When blended, pour over asparagus.

Place in 425 degree oven for 20 minutes. Serves 4.

Health Matters Physical and Mental

The following articles were copied with permission from the *Aviation Medical Bulletin* published by Harvey W. Watt & Co.

FISH AND FISH OIL

Fish oil, from either fish itself (preferably tuna, salmon or mackerel) or from supplements should be a staple in the diets of people with heart disease, says **Doctor Alexander Leaf** of Harvard Medical School. Speaking to *Reuters Health*, **Dr. Leaf** said "taking fish oil concentrate results in a very significant reduction in sudden cardiac death." He urged people at risk to eat two or more meals of oily fish per week or take a daily supplement of fish oil capsules. The protective ingredient appears to be n-3, polyunsaturated fatty acids. In a new study published by the American Heart Association, it was shown that the risk of fatal recurrence of heart disease was 45 percent lower among those who took the supplements.

NUTS-ON-THE-GO

Nuts make good snacks. While nuts are generally high in calories, the fat is mainly monounsaturated which tends to lower LDL "bad" cholesterol. The fiber in nuts also can help lower cholesterol.

STATINS MAY HELP PREVENT BONE FRACTURES

Statins, cholesterol lowering drugs, may also help prevent bone fractures. In a study reported in the *Archives of Internal Medicine* (March 11, 2002) it was found that elderly women who took statins (commonly prescribed statins include Zocor, Mevacor, Pravachol) had 60 percent fewer bone fractures than women not taking the drugs.

TOP NUMBER

Doctors used to show more concern over the bottom number in a blood pressure measurement. Nowadays, the top number-the systolic pressure-has been found to be equally as important. The systolic pressure is the pressure exerted by the heart when it contracts. (The bottom number-diastolic-is the pressure in the arteries between contractions.)

Hypertension in otherwise healthy people is defined as a systolic blood pressure (SBP) of 140 or higher, a diastolic blood pressure (DBP) of 90 or higher, or both. Some people have a normal DBP but an elevated SBP. The term for this is isolated systolic hypertension (ISH). That is the case in 65 percent of persons over age 60.

Recent studies including one published in the March 11, 2002, *Archives of Internal Medicine*, suggested that ISH, which occurs when arteries age and lose their elasticity, is more dangerous than once thought. Aggressive treatment of elevated ISH is important. Check with your doctor.


