
Duplicate Bridge Bob Donahue. Monday following the monthly SIR luncheon at 10 am hosted by different members. Bring lunch.

CHOLESTEROL FREE: SO WHAT?

All margarines are cholesterol free. To put "Cholesterol Free" on the label is, says the *Hope Health Letter*, meaningless.

While there is no cholesterol in any margarine, because all margarines are made with vegetable oils, there is something that you should look for: "trans fat." When an oil such as soybean or sunflower (or any other oil) is hydrogenated or partially hydrogenated, it remains solid at room temperatures and it becomes less likely to spoil (turn rancid).

But the introduction of that hydrogen molecule or molecules causes healthy oil to turn into bad-for-you-artery-clogging trans fat.

So don't pay any attention to the words "Cholesterol Free." Look instead for the words "hydrogenated" and "partially hydrogenated".

GRAPE JUICE LOWERS BLOOD PRESSURE.

Men with elevated blood pressure who drank Concord grape juice for 12 weeks experienced a significant drop in both their systolic and diastolic blood pressures, according to a preliminary study presented at Experimental Biology 2003.

"This is one of the first randomized, double-blind, placebo-controlled studies to use whole juice—in this case Concord grape juice," says Kevin Maki, Ph.D., Director of Nutrition and Metabolic Research Unit, Radiant Research, Chicago. "In our study, blood pressure was measured as part of the basic health information of the study participants. When we reviewed the data, we saw reductions of nearly six points in both systolic and diastolic blood pressure measurements among hypertensive men drinking Concord grape juice. Those on the caloriematched placebo showed no significant change."

The US National High Blood Pressure Education

Program estimates that lowering systolic pressure by five points would result in a 14% reduction in deaths from stroke and 9% reduction from heart disease.

Two previous clinical studies have shown that consuming Concord grape juice improved arterial wall flexibility, suggesting a possible mechanism of action for the reduced blood pressure. Research has also shown that purple grape juice can slow down the oxidation of LDL cholesterol and also inhibit the tendency of blood to clot. The study was underwritten by Welch Foods, Inc.

We love to travel, golf, play bridge and, of course, spend time with the family. SIR Branch 146 activities have become a major part of our retirement lives.






