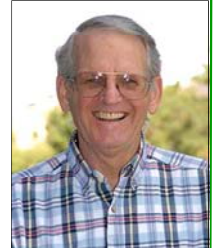

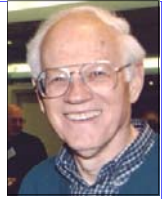

In February, The Explore and Dine group traveled all the way to the Walnut Creek city hall, where we had a very professional presentation and tour of the traffic operations center by **Simin Timuri**, one of the City's traffic engineers. The Power Point presentation was done by **Rafat Raie**, also one of the city's traffic engineers. What we learned is that "it ain't easy folks." The City of Walnut Creek has 96 traffic lights that are monitored and controlled from the traffic operations center, and each light can operate on multiple programs depending on the time of day. The City is also working on adaptive technology that will use real-time information from sensors and cameras to modify traffic light timing to meet the current situation. We were in two groups as the actual traffic operations center could only hold half of us. The other half got to see the presentation and then pepper **Rafat Raie** with questions before their turn for the tour. After the enlightening time at city hall, we dragged the group away to the new restaurant across the street, 'Eleve', which specializes in Asian Fusion food, and was excellent. On April 22, we will join the Garden and Wine Tasting groups in a tour of Fioli Gardens and nearby wineries.
