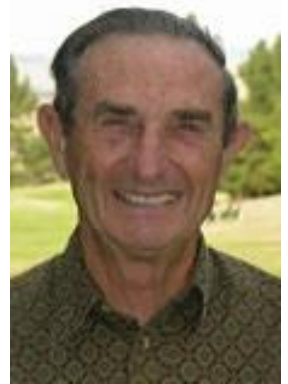

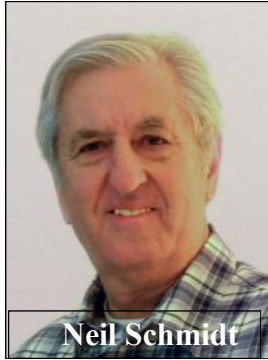

## Old Money Poker Group 6

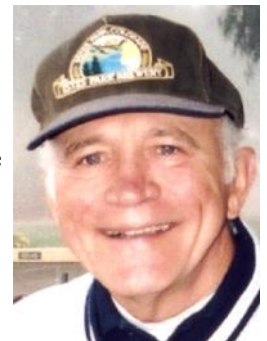

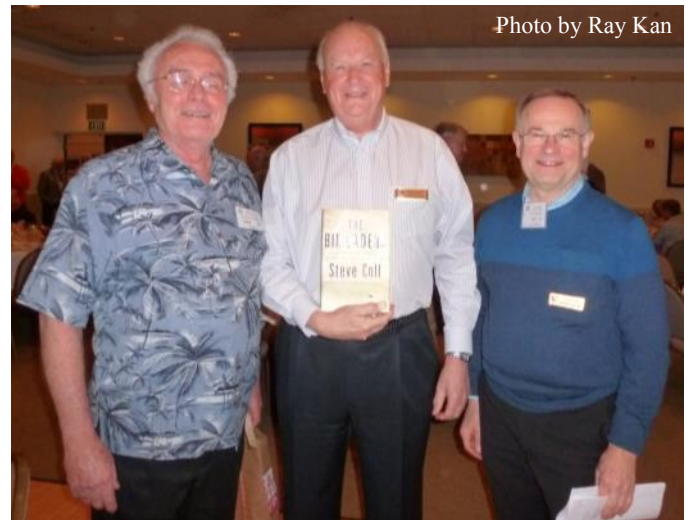

## Photography

Richard Hockenbrock

Our discussion topic for the March meeting was Macro photography and researching equipment and techniques for transferring old photographs and transparency slides into digital files. Utilizing our SIR projector that we use at every meeting, **Roy Hodgkinson, Al Munayer, and Bill Holly** brought macro photos of flowers, unique floor mat designs, and other interesting subjects that reveal themselves under 10 to 20 times magnification.

We also had a photo of a honey bee from National Geographic that was outstanding. The biggest problem we all faced in taking macro shots was keeping the whole subject in focus where, for example, you might have a bee's eye in focus while the wing is out of focus, a distance of maybe  $\frac{1}{4}$  to  $\frac{1}{2}$  inch. Lighting was the biggest variable; the more light you have on the subject, the smaller the aperture opening you can work with. In these circumstances,  $f/22$  is best for long depth of focus and  $f/2.2$  or lower would be the worst. In the second half of the meeting we turned our attention to a member's experience copying old pictures and slides. There are a number of flatbed scanners in the \$50 to \$200 price range that can do a credible job on slides and photos provided you stay with the original photo size. Again we saw some good examples that our members had done with family pictures with only minor post processing tweaking. **Sue Oranje** said she had success with simply holding a DSLR up to a picture and shooting hand held. Another alternative is to send your slides and photos to an outside source like Costco or an online company where prices range from 30 to 50 cents each. Next month's meeting will be back at the library at at our normal starting time (9am) April 16th. The subjects will be flash photography and techniques for making flash photography more pleasing without hot spots or glaring shadows. The second subject will be the beginning of a multi month training



session where we will cover the basics of digital photography a step at a time and learn what all those markings on the top and back of your camera mean and do to enhance your picture taking capability.
