Want to know if your diet is healthy? The US Department of Agriculture's Center for Nutrition Policy and Promotion has created the Interactive

Healthy Eating Index at

www.usda.gov/cnpp/. You can enter what you eat and the website will analyze it in four different ways. **Do you really want to know how you stack up?**

YOU CAN EAT TOO FEW CALORIES

Trying to lose weight? The way to do it is to restrict calories. But, did you know you can eat too few calories? "If you restrict too much for an extended period of time, you can actually trigger what is known as the 'starvation adaptation response.'" This simply means that your metabolism slows down to accommodate your lower caloric intake, and your body conserves fat rather than burning it for energy," says **Susan Kleiner, Ph.D., R.D.**, author of High Performance Nutrition.

When calories are severely restricted, the body thinks that it is starving. Its reaction is to try to hold on to every ounce of fat it can as a means of self-preservation. "Never go below 1,200 calories per day if you're a woman and 1,600 if you're a man," warns Kleiner.

When did I last eat less than 5000 calories per day???

I was born in 1931 in Shadyside, Ohio. As all you geography buffs know, Shadyside lies between Bellaire and Pawhatan-two hotbeds of civilization-on the Ohio river across from Wheeling, West Virginia.

In 1949 during my senior year, I had my first taste of athletic notoriety. While a stellar member of the Shadyside Casketmakers, our basketball team was beaten 103-69 by the Yorkville team. That was bad enough, but one of the Yorkville players individually scored 70 points of their 103 total. That put Shadyside on the sports map and I became a charter member of the Shadyside "Hall of Shame" Still, I did graduate and subsequently enrolled at Miami University (Ohio). While at Miami I was vicariously involved with **Woody Hayes, John Pont, Ara Parseghian, Carmen Cozza**, et al.

During the summer of 1950 while playing some semi-pro baseball, I had my second run-in with fate. I threw a 2-0 waste pitch high and wide to this kid and he hit a triple over the left fielder's head. That kid (drum roll) was future Hall of Famer **Bill Mazerowski**. Maybe that wasn't the hit heard 'round the world, but it really did irritate me.

After graduating in 1953 and after not being drafted by any major league club, you can imagine my excitement when I was drafted by the U.S. Army. I spent the next two years at Camp Gordon, Georgia, where my duty was camp librarian. Since I had learned to read earlier, I was well suited for this top position. One of my fellow soldiers was **Gay Brewer** who was later to be a Masters winner. **Gay** was an MP, but I know he spent most of his time playing golf with the officers while I was reading in the library. Despite the fact that I was Corporal Edwards and knowing that in twenty years I might be a sergeant, I accepted my honorable discharge and returned to Miami University where I earned my teaching credential.

Upon receiving my teaching credential I was recruited by the Mt. Diablo Unified School District and began my teaching career at Pleasant Hill High School. I later earned my Master Degree from Miami, and while at graduate school I met my future wife, **Carol**. We were married in 1961 and have two children, **Heather** and **Blake**. During my 24 years at Pleasant Hill High School, I worked for three members of SIR- **Bill Hansen, Ralph Belluomini, and Chuck Jordan**- who were principals during those years. After Pleasant Hill High School closed, I concluded my teaching career at Ygnacio Valley High School. I retired in 1993.

Since moving to California in 1957, I have played club tennis and have played in several "C" level tennis tournaments with occasional successes. My main recreation is bowling in three Senior Leagues. I still play tennis on weekends when possible. My wife and I enjoy traveling, primarily to England and to various Canadian provinces. We also enjoy the theater, especially in London. We recently visited our daughter in New York and saw "The Producers" which in our opinion is one of the best musical comedies we have seen.

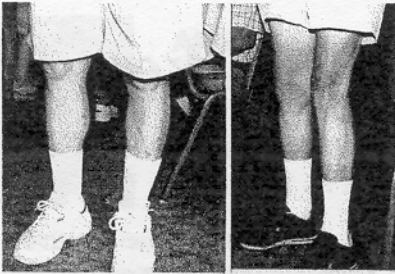

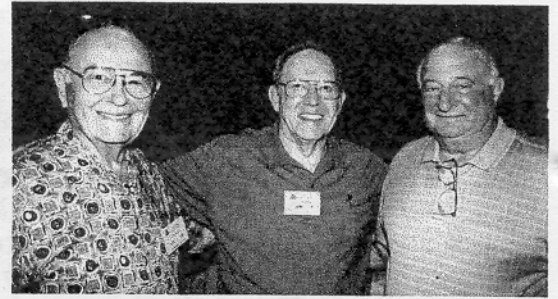
