

#### **Wellness Made Easy**


Avoid sitting with a wallet, or any bulky item, in your hip pocket for long periods of time. It's no joke that people who do so have ended up with what's called "credit card sciatica". Any object that puts pressure on the sciatic nerve can, over time, contribute to sciatica, characterized by pain that begins in the lower back or buttocks and radiates down the leg. Regular exercise may help prevent sciatica by improving posture and strengthening the muscles in the back and abdomen.

Alcohol-based hand sanitizer gels can reduce the spread of some gastrointestinal infections, according to a recent study of 292 Boston-area families with children in daycare. Half were given hand sanitizers and educational materials on hand hygiene; they were told to use the gels in the bathroom, kitchen, and baby's room. Over the next five months they had about 60% fewer infections than the families who received the gel and no hygiene instructions. Alcohol gels kill most bacteria and viruses on the skin, do not require water and, unlike antibacterial soaps, do not promote drug-resistant bacteria. Hand washing with plain soap and water is just as effective at getting rid of germs, but when you don't have access to a sink, alcohol gels are a convenient option.

Older Americans are healthier than they used to be, according to a new report from the Census Bureau. Notably, the proportion of those over 65 with a major disability has dropped by one-quarter, from 26.2% in 1982 to 19.7% in 1999 (the latest year covered by the Census). Without this improvement, there would be at least 2 million additional disabled seniors today. And when people do become disabled, it's at increasingly older ages. The researchers attributed the improvement largely to more prosperity and education than in previous generations. But they cautioned that the rising obesity rate may slow the positive health trends.

To avoid a spider bite, wear gloves and other protective clothing when working in a crawl space, cleaning out the attic, gathering wood, or working outdoors where brush or rocks are piled up. Inspect your shoes before putting them on when camping, or if you haven't worn them in some time. Black widows and brown recluse spiders like such dark places. Most bites can be treated with cold compresses, OTC pain relievers and oral antihistamines. If you develop serious symptoms or if a bite is not healing, get medical help. Fortunately, the fangs of most spiders are too small to pierce the skin.




