

"The Hairy Ape"

An important drama from the 1920's by a prizewinning playwright is the SIR 146 Theatre Party for September.

It will be presented at the Village Theatre in Danville on Thursday, September 23 at 8:00 p.m., produced by the Eugene O'Neill Foundation. Eugene O'Neill's "The Hairy Ape" is an Expressionistic play about a steam-ship stoker who tries to make sense of the world around him. It is a powerful statement about the effects of industrialization and technology on the worker. While set in the 1920s', "The Hairy Ape" is relevant in many ways to contemporary times.

Playwright Eugene O'Neill lived at Tao House, his home in the Danville hills between 1937-1941. Here O'Neill wrote his most notable plays, including "The Iceman Cometh," "A Long Days Journey Into Night," and "A Moon for the Misbegotten." Tao House is now part of the Eugene O'Neill National Historic Site, operated by the National Park Service.




fishing in a while or have never tried it, but might like to test drive an adventure, come join us.
