FISHING REPORT PAUL DUBOW



The weather remained a factor in our fishing efforts, as it has all year. Although the rains subsided in July, the runoff from earlier months of rain kept the waters in the delta, bay, and ocean frothy with good sized waves.

Undaunted, our fearless fishermen set out into these waters, plus there was no risk of big waves in the lakes. **Dick Thomson** caught a large halibut in the bay fishing with Karl Droese, Carl Moyer and his daughter Leah, Joe Miscione, and Terry Miller. Tom Boltz, Bill Baltezore and Pete Gates of Branch 146, along with Joe Karg, caught some kokanee salmon and a few trout in Lake Berryessa. Kent Cremolini enjoyed yet another successful long range ocean trip from San Diego, limiting out on yellowtail and nearly limiting out on bluefin tuna up to 50 pounds. Terry Miller, Craig Walton, George Schulze, Harry Sherinian, Bill Landers, and Karl Droese caught trout at Lake Davis, but the catch was not quite as good as usual because of the wind and rain. Nevertheless, we are planning another outing at Lake Davis in September and all who read this column are welcome to join us. Rich Bal, Ed Dijkman, Paul Corbitt, and Gary Yancey journeyed to Astoria, Oregon on the Columbia River and caught about 85 sturgeon, including nine keepers, in three days. Mike Corker played with leopard sharks and rays in San Pablo Bay. John Wall of Branch 146, joined by Bob Olson, had fun fishing on Fall River for catch and release trout. Gordon Linebaugh caught some rainbow and brown trout at Bucks Lake. Gene Schulting of Branch 146 traveled to Canada and caught northern pike to 44 inches plus a batch of tasty walleyes.
