



Bob & Janet Yolland hosted eight couples for a gala evening of duplicate bridge on July 17th. No substitutes this



When the ocean settles down and the fish show, the salmon fishing has been very good and we have high expectations for the rest of the season. In another outing, Terry Miller and Carl Moyer landed some nice rockfish and ling cod from the big pond. Kent Cremolini and Barry Rauchle joined a group for a five day outing sailing out of San Diego in the rough waters of the Pacific off the coast of Mexico. The group caught bluefin and yellowfin tuna as well as yellowtail. There were five bluefin caught that weighed over 100 lbs., but our duo did not get any of these.

In other venues, **Mike Corker** picked up a keeper striper fishing in Honker Bay and **Karl Droese** and **Paul Dubow** caught a limit of mackinaw trout on Lake Tahoe. **Bill Landers** took a friend's grandson out to the Delta and they landed quite a few black bass.

We will be very busy this summer with Delta fishing for bass, catfish, and sturgeon; trout, king, and kokanee salmon in mountain lakes and rivers; halibut, salmon, and rockfish from the ocean, as well as some long distance trips to Mexico, Canada, and Alaska. I was recently talking to a fellow Sir and he told me about a summer job he had girdling trees. He asked what was the purpose of this. Girdling is defined as constricting or removing the outer tissue around a stem or trunk as deep as or deeper than the cambium, which disrupts the flow of carbohydrates through the phloem. In English this means you are cutting off both water and food to the plant. The result is the tree or plant will die above the area girdled. Therefore I think the purpose of his job was to kill the trees.

On a more positive note, when I got home from a recent trip I found a tiny black looking insect on my fennel. I put the "bug" into a jar with some leaves from the plant and it grew into big green caterpillar. I put a stick in the jar and the caterpillar made a chrysalis. I am now waiting for it to hatch into a black swallowtail. No meeting in July but we have a tentative trip planned with the wine tasting group toward the end of August.




Sir bringing a Guest: Please e-mail also by noon on the Friday prior to the luncheon leaving your name, badge number, and your guest's name with proper spelling.
