Hike". I did this hike last Monday and have decided this will be our next hike. We will be hiking the French Trail loop at Redwood Regional Park. This is a 5.8-mile moderate loop hike that hits all the highlights of this well shaded park nestled in the Oakland hills. It is a peaceful, hidden bowl of coastal redwoods with a creek at the bottom. Notice this hike is rated as moderate and will be our toughest hike yet. I am allotting four hours with plenty of breaks and a lunch stop. Hiking poles are recommended as the last section is a steep short downhill.

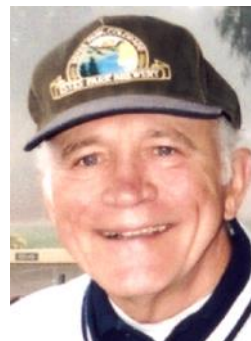

Our speaker for the month of August is Mr. Nan Su. Mr. Su was born and raised in China. He came to the U.S. in 1989. He has been interested in Chinese history and literature since he was very young.

Mr. Su has made many speeches at public events in the past decade on China-related topics. He has been serving as a news commentator for International Chinese Radio and TV Networks since 2003.

In addition to his media work, Mr. Su has also been an activist for China's human rights. He was one of the coordinators of Human Rights Torch Relay in 2008, which made stops in over 100 cities around the world in order to raise international awareness of China's human rights issues.

Mr. Su was instrumental in making San Jose the first stop of the torch relay in North America just before the start of the Beijing Olympics.

The title of Mr. Su's presentation is: "Shen Yun - Reviving 5,000 years of Chinese Civilization". This presentation has been given to over 200 clubs in Bay Area since May of 2011, including 24 SIR branches.

Mr. Su holds a Master degree in Engineering, and has been a professional engineer for over 20 years. He has been married for 22 years, and currently lives with his wife and two daughters in San Jose, California

Ocean fishing is normally our prime endeavor in the summer and that usually divides between fishing for salmon and fishing for ling cod and rockfish. So far this year, the salmon fishing has been awful while the ling cod and rockfish have been plentiful. A good example of the situation involved **John Wall**, and **Paul Dubow** of Branch 146, who were joined by **Carl Moyer**, **Raleigh Davis**, **Gordon Linebaugh** and **Barry Rauchle** on a purported salmon fishing trip out of Bodega Bay. They did not get a single bite and so they turned their attention to ling cod and rockfish and came home with 59 fish, running up to eight pounds. Indeed, the only member of our club who has come home this summer with a salmon caught off the California coast is **Raleigh Davis**, who landed a single salmon on a later trip out of Bodega Bay. In another ocean outing, **George Vogt**, **Harry Sherinian**, and **Carl Moyer** landed a bevy of ling cod and rockfish, fishing out of Pacifica.

On the Delta, **Tom Kostik** continued his successful fishing for black bass and stripers and **Joe Miscione** landed two stripers in Montezuma Slough.

Carl Moyer ended the local trout season with two successful shore fishing trips at San Pablo Reservoir. **Rich Fiscina** of Branch 146 left the Bay Area to catch some trout at Battle Lake.

In other areas, **Joe Miscione** came home with kokanee and king salmon caught in New Melones Reservoir and **Steve Paulick** picked up limits of kokanee on a separate trip to New Melones. **Don Mittelstadt** and **Ernie Wong** ended the shad season in great style, catching and releasing over two dozen of these tough fighters. And **Brad Hatcher** of Branch 146 caught a limit of two mackinaw trout in Lake Tahoe.

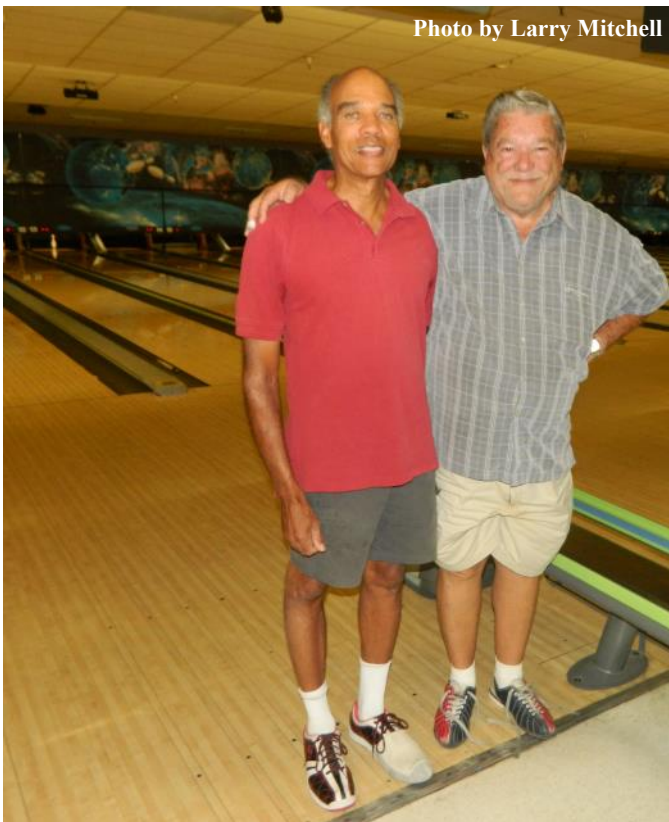

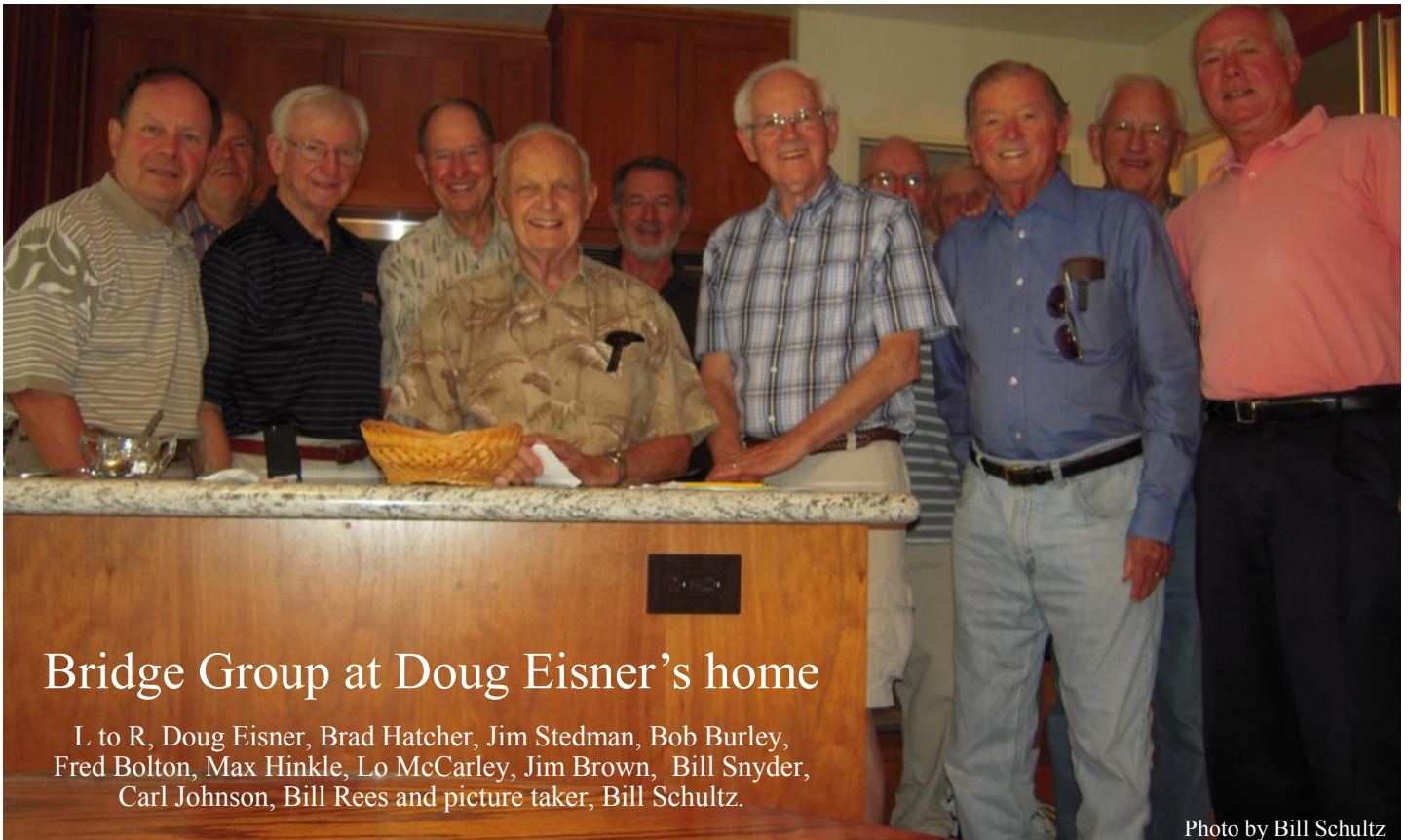
