Jon gives an overview of how oil and gas was formed, where it is found, and the process of extracting it out of the ground, either by conventional methods or by a different and now controversial method known as fracking.

A history of the use of fracking in oil production will be summarized and a "Case For" and a "Case Against" will be presented in which the main arguments for and against will be highlighted. Even though Jon worked in the oil and chemical industry for 45 years, Jon strives to solely educate people on the fracking process and to be unbiased during his presentation.

Jon Dwyer holds a degree in Chemical Engineering from the University of Notre Dame and for over 4 decades has worked in the oil, gas, and chemical industries in the USA and overseas. Jon is currently the Assistant Governor for the Solano County Rotary Clubs and lives in San Ramon with his wife Bonnie.

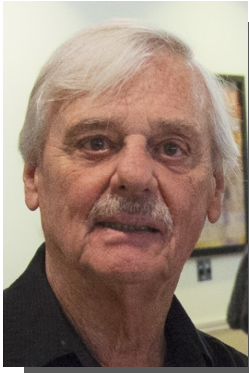

YERBA BUENA COVE, TELEGRAPH HILL & CHINATOWN

On Friday August 14 at 10:00am we will meet at SF Ferry bldg. (Embarcadero BART). This is essentially Hike #1 in Adah B's book "Stairway Walks". Interesting neighborhoods; including the original site of Bank of America. Lots of hills and staircases (most with handrails), and the 400-plus Filbert St. steps (we descend them). Will the wild parrots be there? We will stop at Levi Plaza for lunch and continue on to Chinatown. You will see buildings that were erected on the edge of the shoreline along the middle third of Yerba Buena Cove and now the financial and commercial section of San Francisco. You walk toward Portsmouth Square, which was the center of the Pueblo of Yerba Buena and now is the center of Chinatown; you continue to the slopes of Telegraph Hill where the 19th-century waterfront workers lived. You may feel you are traveling through a land of plaques in this walk. The northeast part of the city is a small, concentrated area where the early Spanish commercial history of San Francisco began. The well written plaques don't overburden you with a multitude of facts; they include just enough to stir up your imagination. Let's admire together the amazing beauty of San Francisco! About 4-5 miles.

Recommend taking BART (I get on at Concord station just before 8:00am, no problem parking and plenty of seats available, by Lafayette usually standing room only and limited parking). Get off at Embarcadero station and walk to Ferry Building with plenty of time to have a cup of coffee and a pastry. If BART works out well for everybody there's some other nice hikes in San Francisco I like to do including the Bay trail from the Cliff House to Golden Gate Bridge and Angel Island.

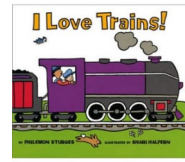
**Mexican Train

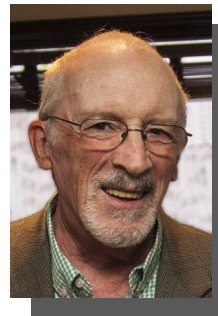
