


July's speaker was Professor Brian Hill (St. Mary's College) who shared his excitement on the upcoming total solar eclipse scheduled for August 21st

French Trail Redwood Regional Park

Please join us Friday, August 11th for a nice <u>cool hike</u> through the redwoods of Oakland. We will be hiking the French Trail loop at Redwood Regional Park. This is a 6 mile single track

moderate loop hike that hits all the highlights of this wellshaded park nestled in the Oakland hills. This is a peaceful, hidden bowl of coastal redwoods with a creek at the bottom. Notice this hike is rated as moderate, I am allotting four hours with plenty of breaks and a lunch stop. Hiking poles are recommended as the first section is a steep uphill. After that will be a mostly level hike through the redwoods.

Take hi-way 13 to Redwood Road, turn left and drive about 4 miles to the Redwood Gate and park in the first lot on the left after the Fishway Interpretive Center. Redwood Regional Park, 7867 Redwood Road.

If you wish to carpool meet at the turnoff at St Stevens Rd off HI-way 24 at 9:30am, Turn right and park on El Nino Rd where there is plenty of parking. I have room for three.



At this time we have 49 people who have a paid reservation for our SIR 146 Explore & Eat group on the USS Potomac that is scheduled for August 17th, 2017. Good news is there some room for more sign-ups! <u>However, there are fewer than 30 tickets left for this voyage so sign-ups are based on space available</u>. This event will start with a slide show presentation of the history of the USS Potomac at 9:45 am at the USS Potomac's office located at 540 Water Street, Oakland (across from the boat dock in Jack London Square). At 10:15 we will board the USS Potomac and depart at <u>10:30 am</u>. The 2 hour cruise/tour will return to Jack London Square at 12:30 pm. We will be making arrangements for lunch in the Jack London Square area immediately following the cruise at approximately 1:00 pm.

Since we have 49 signed up, we have secured the group rate spot on the USS Potomac tour and we have the ability to sign up all future reservations (<u>based on space available</u>) for any additional people that want to go on the cruise at the discounted price. The boat holds 120 people and <u>there are less than 30 spaces open at this time</u>. 

Fishing Report Paul Dubow

The salmon season has been the best in years. **Carl Moyer** and **Bob Stein** scored on trips out of the Golden Gate and Half Moon Bay. **Rich Bal, Ed Dijkman, Karl Droese, Paul Dubow** of Branch 146, and **Rick**

Fend traveled to Gustavus, Alaska and fished in the Gulf of Alaska for salmon and halibut for a week, catching limits of both species each day. Four halibut were over 200 lbs., but they were released and only fish in the 40 lb. category or under were kept. In other travels, **Karl Droese** and **Dick Thomson** fished the Columbia River and caught and released 99 sturgeon, while **Pedro Contreras** and **Steve Paulick** boarded a long range boat out of San Diego and fished the Baja California coast for yellowtail, dorado, and grouper, filling their freezers to capacity.

Closer to home, **Carl Moyer** caught halibut in the bay, rockfish in the ocean, and bluegill and crappie in the Delta. **Ernie Wong** ended a solid season for shad with 20 landed and released on his final day on the American River. **Tom Kostik** and **Mike Corker** worked the Delta successfully on several black bass outings.




