She is going to tell us what she has learned as result of her practice and the effects of the recently passed federal tax law. Beside her accounting practice, she has taught accounting at St. Mary's College and holds an MBA and MS in Taxation. I think you will find her remarks helpful in understanding our tax situations. Please know that her comments will be general and she will not be able to answer questions about your specific situation



Book Group

Six of us gathered at the Greenery on Monday morning, July 15th. Our first order of business was to finish the discussion of the book *The Path Between the Seas*, the story of the creation of the Panama Canal. by David McCullough, a well-known

and prolific author. Most of us were somewhat disappointed in the space given over to the politics, corruption, and greed of the French era that began this effort. The many French names were also difficult to remember and pronounce. We were hoping for more of an engineering approach to the project itself. While the French did indeed make a strong effort, they failed to understand what all they were up against, especially in the areas of sanitation and disease control, especially Yellow Fever and Malaria.

The second half of the book chronicled the US effort, championed by Teddy Roosevelt. He was able to pretty much put the right people in the right jobs, including the doctor who could take on the health and sanitation issues, based on his earlier experiences in the Caribbean. It took awhile, but he did a good job of mastering these problems. The Americans had a "cando" attitude, knowing they would persevere and get it done. There were plenty of politics and not the graft and corruption seen in the French effort. Although a long read, the book leaves the reader with a complete understanding of what it took to build the canal.

We then moved on to the Maltese Falcon. Note none of the book was set on Malta. The writer was Dashiell Hammett, a prolific author of detective stories, whose day job, we learned, was as a Pinkerton detective! The entire book is set in San Francisco, where the lead character, a private detective, Sam Spade, maintains an office. The cast is made up of Sam and his partner Miles Archer, the police who are looking for the killers of the various participants in the hunt for the mysterious Maltese Falcon, especially those whose aim was to find the Falcon, and sell it for a lot of money. We never did find out how much it was really worth. The big finale takes place in Sam's apartment, following which the police catch the bad guys and Sam survives to work again another day. A good and easy read from one of the best mystery writers of his time.

Our next book will be Ron Chernow's *Hamilton*, which we will tackle on Monday, August 12th, at 8:30 am at the Greenery Restaurant.


Our RV trip to Paso Robles is scheduled for September 17th, and we will be staying for one week.



Couples Dining Out Bruce Borgman

Since our July Couples Dining Out event is not until the 29th – we will miss the Sir Call deadline and I will simply repeat that we expect to have a wonderful summertime dining experience at Lucille's Smokehouse

Bar-b-que which is located at the north end of Sun Valley Mall. While part of a chain, they claim to have perfected the art of low and slow cooking of the meats that are commonly used in this southern style of cooking. We were able to get a good all inclusive price, which will include a shared appetizer of southern chicken strips with a honey mustard sauce, a Caesar salad, a choice of five entrees, and the best ever chocolate cake. This description will sadly reach you right after we've enjoyed it but fear not - we had reached our capacity for this restaurant and only with some pleading and cajoling were we able to convince the restaurant to accommodate our entire group inside, rather than on the outside patio. We will have 56 diners, a few more than the restaurant said they could manage inside. We'll tell you how it all worked out in next month's Sir Call.

This does give me the opportunity to poll you on our proposal for the Couples Dining Out event in September. Pete and Gabriela Bishop, gourmands in their own right, urged us to try a restaurant in Antioch called Smith's Landing Seafood Grill - and we joined them earlier this month by trekking out to the east county. We had earlier demurred about considering this restaurant since it is just a bit further than where we normally have our events. From Walnut Creek it's about a 30-35 minute drive. However, after having a sumptuous dinner with the Bishops, we think it is more than worthy of your consideration. Besides some wonderful seafood dishes we had cioppino, stuffed petrale sole and macadamia crusted sea bass - there were beef and pork dishes that would compare with any of our local steakhouses. So, the question, dear diners, posed to you is whether you would be willing to venture out to the East County in September. The cost would likely be a bit more – maybe \$60 – but you will not be disappointed in the cuisine. The restaurant can easily accommodate 60 or more so this time there is not a limit on your participation. Please let us know over the next few weeks whether you would be willing to join us for this culinary adventure – a bit further away.



Long Day's Journey is a memorable play about the playwright's family when he was growing up in New London, Connecticut. His father, James O'Neill, was a prominent actor; his mother – a former convent girl addicted to morphine after childbirth; and his carousing brother Jamie. All have dreams, ambitions and secrets that impact younger brother Eugene (named 'Edmund' in the play). Long Day's Journey into Night is considered one of America's greatest dramas.

SIR 146 Explore & Eat John Muir Home - July *Overflow* Tour



We had 10 participate in July for The John Muir Home Overflow Tour after 27 attended the June Tour. Those in attendance were: Jeff Baily, Loren and Marlene DeLaurenti, Bob and Wendy Lucido, Rich and Kim Pace, Charlie and Diane Walker and Jim Pope. The smaller group toured the Adobe House (John Muir's first house) and the grounds after the John Muir Home tour.

We watched a wonderful film on John Muir's life outlining his career as a farmer, his rise to national environmentalist, lobbyist and friend to Teddy Roosevelt. He was a family man with his wife, two daughters; a writer (12 books) and founder of the Sierra Club. Following the film, we toured the "Big House" (all three floors) which

is a 17-room wood frame mansion of the late Victorian period (Italianate style) built on a knoll with a commanding view of Alhambra Valley. It is a two-story structure with a full basement and attic, a cupola on the peak of the roof, 12-foot high ceilings in the rooms, and over 10,000 square feet of floor space. The house has remained largely unaltered structurally since Muir's time. We then toured the surrounding grounds and other buildings.

After the tour we all proceeded to lunch at the <u>Front Room Restaurant</u> in downtown Martinez for lunch. *Reported by Jim Pope*


