### **SIR Ray Yonce**

Ray, a SIRS member for 3 years, first came to Walnut Creek in 1940 when his father was transferred with Shell Oil Company from the web-foot state of Oregon. Walnut Creek population then was 2000. Three years

later it was off to Benicia. Ray graduated from Vallejo High in 1946 with, "dubious honors" (his words)...... In order to take advantage of the expiring G.I. bill, Ray joined the US Army in September 1946 at the tender young age of 17. He was posted to Mail Clerk in an infantry company acting as

M.P.s for the city of Trieste Italy. He retired from military service after serving 18 months of stressful postal duty, as a buck sergeant.

Immediately after his successful military career he attended San Jose State College graduating in 1952 with a Business degree and a commission in the USAF through the ROTC. He was discharged from the reserve as a 1st Lieutenant. In his senior year Ray was president of his SJSC Theta Chi fraternity, the year it won the coveted Fraternities, National Award as "1952's most outstanding chapter" out of 102 chapters.

After college Ray assisted his father in running a Shell Oil Company wholesale petroleum business throughout Contra Costa County from 1952 to 1958 when highway 24 was a 2 lane road.

In 1958 he developed a company in Martinez that retreaded tires, called Diamond Retread Service serving Contra Costa County from 1958 to 1969.

In 1969 Ray became a licensed real estate agent specializing in residential sales during the rapid growth of the 70,s 80,s and 90,s.

In 1969 the average price of a home in Walnut Creek was \$34,000. It was in 1969 that Ray formed Imperial Realtors. During his real estate career Ray also taught evening real estate courses for nine years at Diablo Valley College. He retired in 1998 after 30 years in the business.

A fraternity brother of Ray's, while in the navy, told a shipmate-dentist (Lee) to look up Ray when he started his WC practice. They met at a WC Optimist Club meeting and roomed together until

Lee married Liz, who, one year later, introduced Ray to a next door teacher friend, Donna....Ten months later they were married. The four have been close friends now for 35 years.

The Yonces have two boys... Jeff lives in Walnut Creek and Brett lives in Orange County. To everyone's delight Jeff and his wife Joyce have two sons.... 2 1/2, and 4 1/2 years old

Ray and Donna have been active in the WC Presbyterian Church for 40 years. The family enjoys snow skiing winters and water skiing in the summer while staying at their mountain home at Tahoe City.


