Big Sir's Commentary:








Know Your SIR **Garth Cummings**



I was born on January 31, 1934 in Oakland, California and was raised in San Leandro where I graduated from high school in 1952. I went on to attend the University of California -Berkeley, following in my father's footsteps, and graduated in mechanical engineering in 1956. Subsequently I received a Masters degree from UC - Berkeley and a

Ph.D. from UC - Davis, in Nuclear Engineering.

I married **Shirley** (Wolfe) in 1956 and we have two children, son Gregg and daughter Jill Brown who also attended UC-Berkeley. We are blessed with three grandchildren, Christina, age 8, Hunter, age 4 and MacKenzie, age 2.

After graduating from UC - Berkeley I went to work for the Lawrence Livermore National Laboratory (then called the Lawrence Radiation Laboratory) as a mechanical engineer involved in nuclear test operations. I participated in operations both at the Nevada Test Site, the Marshall Islands and later in the Aleutian Islands. I also helped design, construct and operate nuclear reactors at the Laboratory and eventually was placed in charge of operations of the lab's research reactor.

Our family moved to the Washington, DC area in 1972 where I participated in a study of the safety of commercial nuclear power plants (Rasmussen Study) and also helped license these plants for the Nuclear Regulatory Commission. Upon returning to Livermore I became Program Leader for nuclear safety work conducted at the lab. Eventually I joined the Director's Office where I assisted the Deputy Director overseeing laboratory environmental, safety and health matters. I retired in 1997 and except for a little consulting am enjoying the retired life with SIRS and at our second residence in Alpine Meadows near Lake Tahoe.

I enjoy skiing and golf, am a member of the American Nuclear Society and recently was named a fellow to the American Association for the Advancement of Science.





Iron-Poor Blood: Not!

The popular advertising catchphrase from a couple of decades ago was "iron-poor blood." Actually the issue may be "iron-rich

blood." The American Journal of Clinical Nutrition (March 2001) found that 13 times as many elderly people (67 to 98 years) have had elevated iron scores as did those who were iron-deficient. Excess iron in older individuals can boost the risk of heart attack and other diseases.

Scientists suggest that one should not take iron supplements without first consulting a healthcare provider.

Why Aspirin Fights Cancer

You know that aspirin can reduce the risk of heart attack. But there is now evidence that it also reduces the risk of colon cancer. A study from Ireland has identified one possible reason for its cancer-fighting capacity.

Aspirin and other anti-inflammatory drugs {NSAIDS} such as ibuprofen and naproxen work to block an enzyme called cyclooxgenase-2 (COX-2). The Irish study linked COX-2 with colon-cancer tumors. A number of epidemiological studies have found that NSAID users have fewer cases of colon cancer than non-users.

Only aspirin, however, has been found to reduce cardiovascular risks.
