#### **Recipe of The Month**

Roasted Rosemary Chicken and Vegetables by Alicia Baily

1/3 cup olive oil

1/3 cup balsamic vinegar

1 Tbsp dried rosemary or 2 Tbsp. chopped fresh rosemary 1/2 tsp red pepper flakes

4 chicken breast halves, skinless and boneless, about 1 pound

1 green pepper, cut into strips

1 red bell pepper, cut into strips

1 small red onion, quartered

3 carrots, cut into 1 inch slices

1 small eggplant, cut into 1/2 inch slices

Preheat oven to 400 degrees.

In a small bowl combine the olive oil, balsamic vinegar, rosemary and red pepper flakes.

Marinate the chicken breasts for 5 minutes in olive-oil mixture.

Place the chicken breasts, reserving the marinade, in a large baking dish.

Add vegetables to marinade and toss to coat. Place vegetables in a single layer next to chicken. Pour reserved marinade over the vegetables.

Bake for 35 minutes, or until the edges of the vegetables brown. Do not overcook the chicken! Serve hot or at room temperature.

# Health Matters Physical and Mental

COX-2 Inhibitors

If you've watched 15 minutes of prime time television in the last year, you've seen advertisements for Celebrex and Vioxx, two new medicines for the relief of arthritis. And those ads have paid off in billions of dollars in sales for the manufacturers, Pharmacia and Merck. It did not take drug producers long to realize the potential sales from promoting their product via "direct-to-consumer" advertising.

But the question is, how good are these new generation anti inflammatory drugs called COX-2 inhibitors? The Harvard Health Letter (Nov. 2001) says they are as good as—but no better than—far less expensive drugs called NSAIDS that have been on the market for years. Ibuprofen (trade name Motrin and Advil) and Naproxen (trade name Aleve) are no less effective.

The message from ads is that COX-2 inhibitors are easier on the stomach, but the fact is that the incidences of nausea are virtually identical with the older drugs. The difference is that Celebrex and Vioxx appear to cause fewer ulcers and other gastrointestinal (GI) complications. What manufacturers don't point out, however, is the

occurrences of these kinds of problems from the older medications—which are only 2% to 3%—are only reduced to 1% to 1.5% with COX-2 inhibitors. Since only a small percentage of patients are susceptible to the GI side effects of the older drugs, the marketing campaign that suggests that everyone with arthritis will benefit simply isn't true.

Add to this a new study published in the Journal of the American Medical Association (Aug. 22/29, 2001) that associated COX-2 inhibitors to an increased risk in heart attacks, and you complicate the issue even more.

Arthritis literally means "inflammation of a joint." It is not one disease, but over one hundred different manifestations of inflammation of joints and connective tissues. Over-the-counter NSAIDS (non steroidal anti-inflammatory drugs) are quite effective in controlling inflammation, and there are more powerful ones that require a doctor's prescription. COX-2 inhibitors are another class of NSAIDS.

What's the bottom line? The Harvard Health Letter points out:

- 1. Celebrex and Vioxx are not better at relieving pain and inflammation than older NSAIDS.
- 2. Of the people who take NSAIDS, only a small minority experience GI problems.
- 3. COX-2 inhibitors are not easier on the stomach if nausea is the problem.

What am I doing here - a multi-engine land based pilot on a heavy cruiser? I guess the Admiral needed help with his mail. Six months later (you guessed it) they sent me back to Newfoundland.


