Recipe of the Month

Mexican Zucchini Casserole. Serves six to eight

4 cups shredded zucchini

1/2 cup finely chopped onion

3 Jalapeno peppers, seeded and finely chopped

4 eggs

1/4 cup vegetable oil

1-1/2 cups Bisquick

1/2 cup grated cheese

salt and pepper to taste

Preheat oven to 375 degrees

In a large bowl mix together zucchini, onion and peppers. In a smaller bowl beat eggs together with oil until combined. Add to vegetable mixture and stir until combined. Add Bisquick and cheese to vegetable/egg mixture. Stir well until baking mix is fully moistened. Add salt and pepper to taste.

Pour into a buttered 9 x 13 inch glass baking dish. Top with more grated cheese, if desired.

Bake for 30 to 40 minutes or until top is browned from heat and cool slightly. Cut into squares and serve warm.

The versatility of this dish is wonderful. We have served it hot, cold and even have frozen it. It is also a great hors d'oeuvre when cut into bite size pieces and served with your favorite libation.


Cribbage

Tired of spam email?

I have heard of many ways to avoid getting spam email. Here are two that are interesting:

- 1. Create a 2nd email address and give that out to commercial enterprises or discussion groups that you are communicating with. Expect spam email at that address.
- 2. Use a different version of your email address that others will understand, but that spam tools can't automatically pick up and add to their mailing list

For example, if your actual email address is "emailname@account.com", use "emailname (removethis)@account.com" as your *modified* email address. In this case, the spam tools will send mail to an invalid email address, and others will know to exclude the "(removethis)" when they send you email.

When you post a question or reply to a discussion group, just enter your *modified* email address in the appropriate box.

WANT TO LOSE WEIGHT? THEN SPEED UP YOUR METABOLISM.

Why should you want your metabolism sped up? The answer is simple. Metabolism is the chemical process by which the body burns calories. The faster your metabolism, the more calories your body will burn at rest.

Your body's resting metabolic rate depends to a great degree on your body's muscle mass. Fat doesn't burn calories; muscle tissue does. So the more muscle, the more calorie-burning potential there is.

So the first thing in revving up your metabolism is to lift weights. Strength training builds muscle cells; muscle cells burn calories, even when they are resting. If you're new to weight training, begin with a weight that will cause your muscle to fatigue (that is, not be able to lift the weight any more) after eight to twelve lifts (called repetitions).

Do those eight to twelve repetitions one to three times (called sets) two to three days a week.

If losing weight is your goal, see a personal trainer about weight lifting. Weight training will, in effect, train your engine to burn more fuel.

Cardiovascular exercise will burn calories while you are doing it, so you'll want to include aerobic activities in your exercise regimen. Weight training, on the other hand, will help your body burn calories 24 hours a day.

Here are some non-prescription remedies that may help:

Tar-containing shampoos,

such as Denorex and Neutrogena T/Gel

Salicylic acid-containing shampoos,


