THE YEAR 1905

What a difference a century makes. Here are some of the U.S. statistics for the Year 1905:

- The average life expectancy in the U.S. was 47 years.
- Only 14 percent of the homes in the U.S. had a bathtub.
- Only 8 percent of homes had a telephone.
- A three-minute call from Denver to New York City cost \$11.
- There were only 8,000 cars in the U.S., and only 144 miles of paved roads.
- The maximum speed limit in most cities was 10 mph.
- With a mere 1.4 million people, California was only the 21st most populous state in the Union.
- The tallest structure in the world was the Eiffel Tower.
- The average wage in the U.S. was 22 cents per hour.
- The average U.S. worker made between \$200 and \$400 per year.
- More than 95 percent of all births took place at home.
- Ninety percent of all U.S. doctors had no college education.
- Instead, they attended so-called medical schools, many of which were condemned in the press and by the government as "substandard".
- Sugar cost five cents a pound, eggs were fourteen cents a dozen and coffee was fifteen cents a pound.
- Most women only washed their hair once a month, and used borax or egg yolks for shampoo.
- Canada passed a law that prohibited poor people from entering into their country for any reason.
- Five leading causes of death in the U.S. were: Pneumonia and influenza, tuberculosis, diarrhea, heart disease and stroke.
- The American flag had 45 stars. Arizona, Oklahoma, New Mexico, Hawaii and Alaska hadn't been admitted to the Union yet.
- The population of Las Vegas, Nevada was only 30.
- Two out of every 10 U.S. adults couldn't read or write.
- Only 6 percent had graduated from high school.
- Marijuana, heroin and morphine were all available over the counter at the local corner drugstores.
- Eighteen percent of households had at least one full-time servant or domestic help.
- There were about 230 reported murders in the entire U.S.
