I first want to thank members who served on the 2007 Executive Committee. Branch 146 is better off now, and will be better off in the future, because of their leadership.

The Executive Committee voted to increase Branch maximum membership to 270 and to

induct 30 new members for the year, at the rate of three new members per month, in order to stop branch ageing and to begin the replenishment of younger members. As a result, membership increased from 245 to 254.

There was no increase in branch average age and the number of younger members increased to 45. A total of about 80 younger members are needed to reach the desirable goal of being in balance with older members. This is a successful start in the process to maintain the health and vitality of Branch 146. Let's keep it going.

We have a history of good leadership in Branch 146. This will continue as ten members inducted in the last two years assume leadership positions in 2008. We welcome their energy and new ideas.

All of our activities are successful and robust. We started three new activities this year. All are chaired by newer members: The Book Exchange Group-**Terry Marchione**, Explore and Dine-**John Pearl** and Guys Dine Out-**Mal Hendry**. There are now 32 different activities available for Branch 146 members. A large selection of activities is crucial for the future success of Branch 146.

All activity chairmen did outstanding jobs in 2007 and I commend them. **Dick Richmond** and his golf committee are to be particularly congratulated for reenergizing the golf program. We now have free golf lessons from time to time, a new nine hole golf program with good participation, a variety of formats for Tuesday golf, good participation in Area and State tournaments and a fine Away Golf program headed by **Jim Baldridge**.

As each of us reflects upon how much we benefit from our membership in SIR Branch 146 let's think about bringing a guest to lunch and sponsoring a new member.

In conclusion I say thank you to **Jeff Baily** for his friendship, collaboration and support during 2007 when he was Little Sir. **Jeff** is a fine and deserving Big Sir. He is the right leader at the right time for Branch 146 in 2008.

#### Aspirin: how to decide

People at high risk for cardiovascular disease (CVD), which includes may men over 40 and women over 65, should be taking low-dose aspirin. But a new survey of adults over 40 in *American Journal of Preventive Medicine* found that many who are at high risk are not taking it. Part of the problem is that people often don't know if they're at high or low risk. Here are some findings:

- Percent of respondents who were at high risk, based on reported risk factors: 42%
- Percent of those who believed they were at low risk but actually were at high risk: 28%
- Percent of those who believed they were at high risk but actually were at low risk: 44%
- Percent of a respondents taking aspirin: 41%
- Percent at high risk taking aspirin: 57%
- Percent at low risk taking aspirin: 30%
- Percent who discussed aspirin with their doctors: 33%
- Percent of those taking aspirin who discussed it with their doctors: 88%
- Take-home message: The best way to evaluate your risk and see if you should take low-dose aspirin is to talk to your doctor.

# When shopping for a car, look for one with an electronic stability control (ESC) system.

Such systems could prevent up to 30% of all U.S. automotive fatalities, saving as many as 9,600 lives each year, according to the National Highway Safety Administration.

That would make ESC the greatest highway lifesaver since safety belts. An extension of antilock brake technology, ESC sensors can detect when a driver is about to lose control--for instance, during a skid--and brake individual wheels to keep the car under control. ECS is especially effective in preventing fatal single-vehicle crashes, such as rollovers (which SUV's are most prone to). ESC is now standard or optional in more than half of vehicle models, mostly more expensive one. A proposed federal rule would require all vehicles to have ESC by 2012.

# To prevent onions from making you cry when you chop them, try some of the following steps:

Put them in the freezer for 10 minutes beforehand. Use a sharp knife so you can cut faster. Aim a fan to blow the fumes away. Wear goggles. Use sweeter varieties such as Vidalias or purple onions (or related shallots and leeks). And, of course, there's always the food processor. Never wipe your eyes with your hands while peeling or chopping.

When cut, onions release an enzyme that causes the formation of a chemical that irritates the tear glands.
