



We all have them and have to deal with them. A weed seed can be viable for years. You have to be persistent in controlling them.

Garden tip of the month: The color of light can affect seed germination. Blue and red light stimulate or inhibit germination, depending on species. Under natural full-sun conditions, there is enough red and blue light present to cause these effects.

Our December game will be held at **Skip's** place. We hope **Bill Roberts.** makes a speedy recovery and will be able to join us.



The stripers are also biting. Stan Matsumoto of Branch 146 went fishing with his brothers in Broad Slough and caught limits of stripers up to six pounds. Joe Miscione yielded to the wind and fished from shore on the Sacramento and also landed a number of the striped fish.

We will be very busy this winter, if the wind ever dies down, with delta fishing for bass, catfish, and sturgeon, trout fishing in Shadow Cliffs and other local lakes, and party boat trips for sturgeon. 


