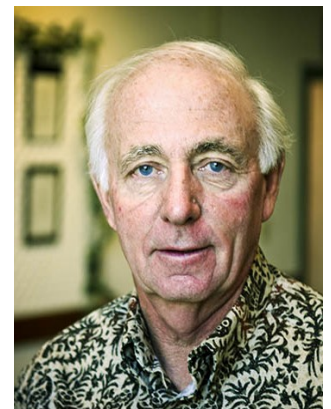

At our meeting on Monday November 12, **Max Burchett** and **Jeff Baily** conducted a class on Mac MAIL, the application that most Mac users use for email.

Of particular interest to attendees was how to organize and use the address book - how to add and subtract names, email addresses, phone numbers and other data pertaining to persons that you put in your address book. We discussed how to create groups and add a name from the main list into one or more groups. Once creating a good address book was complete, we discussed how to send group mailings and how to ensure that the mail outs are secure from phishing attacks and other risks. We also discussed creating a new email address.

Then moving from the basic to the abstruse, **Max** talked about downloading and installing an update for Adobe Flash Player that closes several security holes that have been discovered recently. The whole two hours went by quickly and judging by the questions and comments was a huge success. Next month's meeting on December 10<sup>th</sup>, we will discuss [teach] SAFARI, the web browser that is included with the Mac Operating System. We will begin with the basics, including the main menu items used during a typical browsing session, the preference options, and finish with a discussion of sensible precautions to use while touring the Internet.

Later, **Carl** took his daughter sturgeon fishing in the same locale and she caught a 53 inch keeper, her first sturgeon ever. **Carl** and **Paul Dubow** fished out of Pittsburg a few days later and landed seven sturgeon and three stripers, releasing all but one striper. **Joe Peterson** landed a 6 lb striper near his home on Sherman Island. **Paul Dubow** and **Bill Landers** tried a change of pace and went black bass fishing in the Delta. The fishing was slow and so they decided to fish for stripers before they came in, and **Paul** caught and released a 13 pounder.

The winter trout season has begun. **Pete Gates** and **Brad Hatcher** of Branch 146 joined **Carl Moyer** at Shadow Cliffs Reservoir and they limited out. **Harry Sherinian**, **Bill Landers**, and **Barry Rauchle** tried Shadow Cliffs on another occasion but had mixed results. **Jack Waddell** made three trips to Los Vaqueros Reservoir and caught and released about 30 trout up to 16 inches plus a few small stripers.

**Carl Moyer** and **Terry Miller** caught rockfish and ling cod in the ocean and that was followed by a fish fry at **Carl's** home where 20 members of our group enjoyed eating the catch as well as a large amount of yellowtail cooked in garlic butter that was contributed by **Terry** and some smoked salmon contributed by **Tom Boltz**.

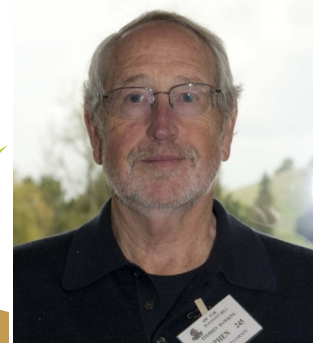
Our next meeting will be on Thursday, December 20 at the Legends Sports Bar and Grill at Diablo

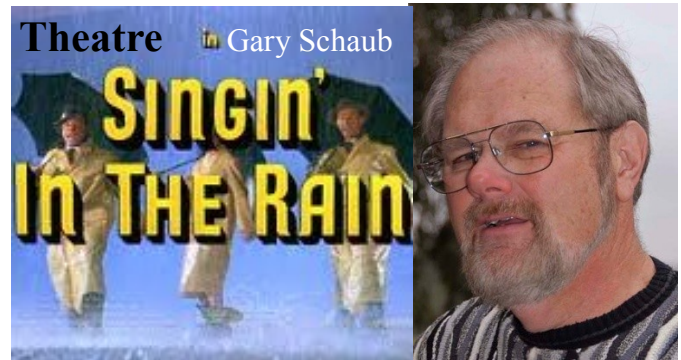
Completion of the round was celebrated with beer and French fries at the Boundary Oak grill as the rest of the field arrived to shake **John's** hand and wish him congratulations.
