The table is set for one, symbolizing the frailty of one against many oppressors. The tablecloth is white symbolizing the purity of intention of one who answers his country's call to arms.






Old Money Poker Group 6




Poker Club 4 Chuck Bobinecz

We are not meeting in December due to the Christmas holiday but will resume in January with host Sir **Garth Cummings**.



SIR 146 Hiking Rich Ahlf



The Book Corner has been a continued success over the past years because of the willingness of our members to share their books. We anticipate this participation will continue. The Book Corner will


be open the following months in the future: January, March, May, July, September and November.


We had a number of new attendees – we always like to engage new SIRs and their spouses in this fun activity.


GOLF Ray Weisz


Cribbage John Pearl






