



Carl Moyer had an equally fruitless experience fishing for sturgeon in the Delta, but he did well on rockfish and ling cod in the ocean. Don Mittlestadt and Jim Andrews had a successful fly fishing adventure on Lake Davis, landing a number of large rainbows. Joe Miscione and his son tested their new boat in rockfish trips out of Monterey and striper fishing in the Delta and brought back quite a few fish for the freezer.

Of course, the highlight of the month was our semi-annual fish fry at **Carl Moyer's** home. **Carl** prepared filets of rockfish and ling cod that were cooked by **Paul Dubow** and **Gene Schulting** of Branch 146, ably aided by **Ray Pixton. Tom Boltz** of Branch 146 contributed appetizers of smoked salmon that he caught in Alaska earlier this year.

We will be very busy this winter with delta fishing for catfish, striped bass, and sturgeon; trout in local lakes; and rockfish and ling cod in the ocean. 
Mexican Train Dominoes Group 2 (DOS)


Golf is one of our most popular activities with over 100 registered golfers. We are fortunate to have a large assortment of venues and formats. We play Tuesdays at
