Know Your SIR! SIR Bob Mehus

Bob Mehus joined SIR in 1997. He returned to the working world as a part-time counselor

at Miramonte H.S. and has been on Standby status for a couple of years. Finally, grasping the idea that the "R" in SIR designates "Retired," he has returned as an active member.

In the 30's Bob's parents emigrated from Norway to Seattle where he attended Roosevelt H.S. (go Teds!) and the Univ. of Wash. (go DAWGS!).

His only military experience was as a "weekend warrior" at the Sand Point Naval Air Station in an anti-sub squadron, VS893. Those undergrad summers as a fruit and veggie inspector for the USDA in western Wash. and Ore. were great.

Tiring of too many gray days in the northwest, Bob headed south in a '50 Lincoln (perfect for Drive-In movies) in 1958, to attended Physical Therapy school at Stanford (go "Tree"), met Sandy, who was graduating from the UC Med. Keep your eyes focused on the ceiling.
