

AVOIDING THE BUG

Researchers at the University of Arizona found that, in order, the top five germ-contaminated office spots are: phone, desktop, water fountain handle, microwave door handle, computer keyboard.

One way to stop the spread of cold and flu germs is to frequently clean your desk, telephone, computer key board, mouse and other office items.

Just like doorknobs, shopping cart handles, or shaking hands with someone, these are places where germs spread easily from one person to another.

According to a 10 year study at the University of Western Ontario, that's how much you can cut your risk for diabetes and heart disease with exercise, even if you don't start until you are 55. All it takes is 30 to 45 minutes of walking, 3 days a week.

COUNTING YOUR STEPS

If your goal is to walk 10,000 steps a day, the equivalent of 30 minutes of brisk exercise, here are some counting hints:

- One mile = 2,000 to 2100 steps.
- Nine holes of golf without a cart = 8000 steps.
- One city block = 200 steps.
- The average person walks about 1,200 steps in 10 minutes (not a brisk pace).
- An easy way to check the accuracy of a pedometer is to walk where you know the distance, such as on a track or around a football field.
- If you walk in a shopping mall, the mall public relations office should also be able to tell you the distance.

MORE FIBER, MORE ENERGY?

A daily bowl of high-fiber cereal may help fight fatigue. In a two-week study of 140 adults, funded by Kellogg's, researchers in Wales found that those who ate a bowl of fiberrich cereal (5 or 10 fiber grams per serving) for breakfast reported feeling less tired than those who ate a low-fiber cereal. Previous evidence has shown that high-fiber foods are digested more slowly and may thus be less likely to cause a spike and subsequent, fatiguing crash in the blood sugar level. While this study tested only cereal, other fibrous morning foods--- such as whole-grain breads, fruit, or peanut butter---would likely confer a similar benefit.
