weeks, catching tuna up to 231 lbs, a 140 lb marlin, and lots of smaller tuna. **Kent** is leading a group of us there on June 12 and we hope that we can match Kent's feat. Sal Costanza fished at the mothball fleet and picked up a striper. Craig Walton joined a black bass tournament on Lake Berryessa, and managed to catch a bass on a very slow winter bite. A group of ten fished the Delta (off Sherman Island), including Pete Gates, Paul Dubow, Tom Boltz, and Gene Schulting of Branch 146. Fishing was moderate and we managed to catch five keeper sized stripers, a few smaller stripers, and some starry flounder. For the second month in a row, **Gene** was the champ on a group outing, picking up three of the keeper stripers. Earlier, Carl Mover and Harry Sherinian fished at the mothball fleet and caught a large amount of kingfish and flounder and three shaker sturgeon. Carl also fished the same area on two other occasions plus the water near the Dumbarton Bridge with moderate results. **Don Mittelstadt** fly fished for steelhead on the Mokulumne and Yuba Rivers and landed one steelhead.
