

Free 911 cell phone service for seniors

The Walnut Creek Police Department is proud to announce its participation in the 911 Cell Phone Bank Program. This program was developed to provide community members, who cannot otherwise afford to buy a cell phone, with an emergency use cell phone via 911. The Walnut Creek Police Department will then be able to provide cell phones to domestic violence victims and vulnerable seniors who are in need of an emergency cell phone through our partnership with the 911 Cell Phone Bank. Through this partnership, the Walnut Creek Police Department is now a designated "drop off" point in Contra Costa County for all retired cell phones. All donated cell phones are then shipped to the 911 Cell Phone Bank where they are refurbished, tested, and ready to use for 911 emergency calls only. Anyone with an unused cell phone is encouraged to donate/recycle their cell phones at the Walnut Creek Police Department. Drop offs can be made at the following address:
