Finally, a little rain. All our plants should start jumping for joy. On February 2nd we will be pruning roses at Heather Farms, starting at 9:30am. All helping hands are welcome. On March 1st we will be visiting the home of **Bob Erhardt** in Walnut Creek. Bob is a world renowned Camellia grower and he will share with us some of his over 1200 plants. A few tips about growing camellias. If you want bigger blossoms, disbud your plants. Most camellias will set clusters of buds. Remove the small buds and save the larger bud. Much like you do with fruit trees. One of the more common problems with camellias is petal blight. This is when brown lesions develop on the petals, the centers discolor and the blossoms rot. The way to prevent this is to pick and dispose of all blighted blossoms that have fallen and avoid overhead irrigation. Garden on!
