

Are you making the most of your SIR membership? If you are new to SIR, I encourage you to get involved with one or two activities right away. You attended your first luncheon, so now what? Joining an



In a ceremony at the January 9th Branch 146 luncheon, two of our most well deserving members, **Walt Busenius** and **Bill Holly**, received the prestigious award of Honorary Life Member presented by State HLM **Dick DeVoe** and State President **Ed Benson**, respectively. **Doug Eisner**, started the event and served as MC. **Walt's** and **Bill's** service in SIR, which began when they joined in 2008, has been exemplary as required by State Policy 10 for the award.

Walt served as a Branch Director for 2 years and Sunshine Chairman for 4 years before becoming Asst Secretary, then Secretary in 2014, Little Sir in 2015, and Big Sir in 2016. **Walt** served as Nominating Committee Chairman and Honoree Chairman in 2017 at the branch level before moving to the state level in 2018 where he served as Area 16 Governor for two years.

Bill served as Wine Tasting Chairman for six years beginning in 2009. He served as a Branch Director in 2012 and as Activity Chairman and Branch Director in 2013 before becoming Little Sir in 2014, and Big Sir in 2015. **Bill** served as Nominating Committee Chairman in 2016 and Area 16 Governor starting in the second half of 2016 through 2017. **Bill** also served as Region 5 Director in 2018 and 2019.







SIR 146 Hiking Mark Curtis

We will be hiking the Ridgetop loop trail in Shell Ridge Open Space on Friday, February 14th, at 10:00 am. We will meet at Borges Ranch parking lot for staging. There are wonderful views

from the top of the ridge of nearby populated areas nearby as well as Mt. Diablo.

This hike is moderate with about 900 feet cumulative elevation gain to the ridge top and is about 6 miles long. This is a loop hike starting with the Ridgetop trail to Fossil Hill, then India trail back to Borges Ranch. We will take a break at the highest point on the loop. We will probably take a short break at Fossil Hill to observe new plantings of California native plants. There might be opportunity to speak with a few volunteers who work on this restoration project.

From intersection of Ygnacio and Oak Grove roads, go towards Boundary Oak golf course on Oak Grove, take the round-about and exit on Castle Rock road. Proceed about 2 miles to a right turn to the entrance to Borges Ranch. From the turn it's about 1 mile to the parking lot.



Historic Benicia State Capitol Tour

And Fischer-Hanlon House (Next Door) March 6th, 2020 Friday at 10:30 am in Benicia



The Explore & Eat event will tour the Benicia Capitol State Historic Park and Fischer-Hanlon House located next door. The tour is on Friday, March 6th in Benicia at 10:30 am. The Benicia Capitol is located at 115 West G Street Benicia, CA 94510

Benicia Capitol State Historic Park is the site of California's third seat of government (1853-54). It is the only pre-Sacramento Capitol that survives. The original building has been restored with reconstruction period furnishings and exhibits. The interior includes a board-for-board reconstruction of the

building's original floor with ponderosa pine. The desks, three of which are originals from the Benicia period or earlier, are furnished with a candlestick, a 19th century newspaper, a quill pen and a top hat. Located next door to the Benicia Capitol State Historic Park is the **Fischer-Hanlon House**. This house had once been part of a fire-damaged, gold-rush-era hotel. Joseph Fischer, a prominent businessman in Benicia, purchased a salvageable portion of the hotel and moved it to its current location at 135 West G Street. The hotel was converted to a home for Fischer's family sometime after 1858. In 1968 the family deeded the house with its original artifacts and furnishings to California State Parks. Presently, the house interprets the lives of its upper middle-class family residents from the mid -1800's through 1968. Following the tour we are having lunch at Sailor Jack's at 123 1st Street, Benicia CA.

The cost of the tour is \$3.00 per person (\$6/couple) for the docent lead tour. We have room for 40 participants. 


