



Health Matters, Physical and Mental

Pulse Pressure

There's a new measurement for blood pressure. Systolic pressure (the top number) has replaced diastolic pressure (the bottom number) as the main focus for detection, evaluation and treatment of hypertension. But now some experts are suggesting that it is the

difference between these two numbers that is the most relevant factor in predicting heart disease risk. The difference is called pulse pressure.

Healthy blood vessels are elastic; they give with each heartbeat as blood is forced through them. When the arteries are stiff, they don't give as much, and the pressure goes up. Now doctors are taking a look at the difference between the systolic and the diastolic pressures. A difference of 50 Hg is considered normal. When the difference gets up to 60 Hg it is getting on the high side.

Research reported in *Circulation* (July 27, 1999) based on data from the Framingham Heart Study concluded that pulse pressure is an important indication of heart disease risk. Since it is the systolic pressure that tends to go up as we get older, controlling systolic pressure (which most hypertension drugs on the market do) appears to be the proper course of action in keeping pulse pressure in line.

Cholesterol Numbers

Normal cholesterol numbers are good, excellent cholesterol numbers are excellent. Here's a look at both sets for various cholesterol readings:

Cholesterol	<u>Normal</u>	Excellent
Total	180 mg/dl	140 to 150 mg/dl
HDL cleans arteries	>40 mg/dl	>70 mg/dl
LDL Clogs arteries	< 120 mg/dl	<80 mg/dl
VLDL Clogs arteries	<15 mg/dl	<10 mg/dl

Know Your SIR

Dean Merritt



Born in a small town in Iowa, the youngest of ten children, he grew up in Burbank, California. After high school, Dean attended Compton College for two years and decided that what he really wanted to be was a Naval Aviator. (This decision came before his first commercial


flight.) He joined the Navy as a NAVCAD and started flight training in October 1955. He completed ground school, primarily in prop driven aircraft and was selected for the jet syllabus in Memphis, Tennessee. He received his commission in 1956 and after a short stay in Newport, R.I., Dean was assigned to VA146 at NAS Miramar, California. His first and only cruise was to bring the USS Ranger around South America to be home ported on the west coast.

In September of 1958, his life changed drastically: Dean was returning to Miramar when several bad things happened simultaneously. The tower at Miramar was changing from local control to a radar approach control facility. Unbeknownst to Dean, a leading edge droop on the FJ-4B he was flying failed to extend so he did not have the proper wing thickness on one side of the aircraft. As he turned into final an aircraft passed just under him. That aircraft had an afterburner and Dean did not. As Dean's engine was accelerating, the other aircraft's afterburner cut in and he pulled forward and ahead. Dean sank into his slipstream. Dean's right wing stalled and he found himself in a wing-down, nose down, headed for the ground, and pointed at three aircraft that were preparing to take off. About all he had time to do was level his wings and apply full rudder to avoid those aircraft. He plowed into soft dirt perpendicular to the duty runway. The aircraft stayed together and came to rest, which would have been fine until he blew the canopy and heard the crackle of flames. Integrated flight suits were not in use as they are today. In haste, Dean began to disconnect all the things that attached him to the airplane. When he thought he was free of all the connections, he proceeded to go over the side because he was afraid the aircraft was going to explode. Instead, he got hung up with one strap he had not disconnected. As a result, he was inside a fireball for about a minute. As a result of that one minute exposure, he lost his right hand; went through 18 months in the hospital; had surgery 13 times. After recovery at San Diego Naval Hospital, he was transferred to Oak Knoll Naval hospital for therapy

and prosthetics. Four months before he completed treatment, he married his first wife, Audrey. Dean and Audrey had three daughters. Dean went to work at the Naval Air Rework Facility Alameda. Dean finished his college work at night at Golden Gate University. In 1974, he was selected as the first recipient of the Sonny Montgomery Fellowship and attended the University of Southern California where he received his Masters degree in 1975. Dean became the Head of the Management Controls Department in 1977 and moved to the Production Planning Department in 1986. He retired in 1990 after 30 years at the Facility. Dean lost his first wife Audrey to cancer in 1992. In 1994 Dean married **Daphne Heckenlively**, whom he had known for more than 25 years. They are absolutely enjoying retirement. They both enjoy golf, travel, and their seven grandchildren.


