Health Matters Physical and Mental

FIBER AND STATINS TEAM UP

If your cholesterol-lowering statin isn't quite powerful enough to drop your LDL (bad) cholesterol as low as it should go, adding a fiber supplement could give you the edge you need. In a study at the Robert Wood Johnson Medical School in New Jersey, volunteers who took 10 milligrams (mg) of simvastatin (Zocor) a day lowered their LDL levels a respectable 29%. In those who took 10 mg of Zocor plus 5 mg of soluble fiber in the form of psyllium (Metamucil) three times a day, LDL levels dropped 36%---the same as seen with twice as much Zocor. If you choose this approach, make sure you drink more water, otherwise you run the risk of constipation.

Better yet, get your extra fiber by eating more fruit, vegetables, and whole grains such as oatmeal. A whole food approach can complement a statin's cholesterol-lowering effect, and do so much more.

WHAT HAPPENS WHEN YOU LAUGH?

- Reward centers in your brain are triggered---the same effect that occurs with habit forming drugs.
- Your heart rate increases along with your pulse and blood pressure. Muscles contract---not just your facial muscles, but your core muscles. (Remember when you laughed so hard your stomach hurt?) So when you stop laughing, muscles relax and you feel relaxed---inside and out.
- Certain immune-boosting antibodies are stimulated. (Research has shown this effect for people with rheumatoid arthritis.)
- Your endocrine system produces helpful stress reducing hormones. The way laughter works is no laughing matter— It's a serious science called gelotology and has nothing to do with Jell-O.

SPORTS DRINKS ERODE TEETH

Sports beverages, energy drinks, and other flavored beverages may do far more damage to your teeth than plain old cola. Researchers at the University of Maryland exposed healthy molars to various flavored drinks for two continuous weeks. Beverages such as KMX, Red Bull, Gatorade, and Powerade caused up to 11 times more erosion of tooth enamel than Coca-Cola. Limit your intake of those drinks, as well as of bottled lemonade, which also yielded high damage, and possibly other citrus-flavored drinks. If you do indulge, drinking the beverage all at once or through a straw may cause less damage than sipping it, dentists say.
