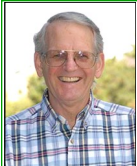

Party Bridge Fred Bolton

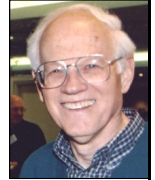

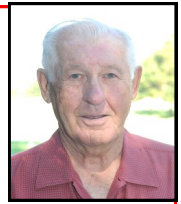

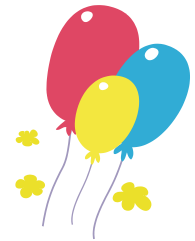
