Now that the holidays are over here is a brief history of the most ubiquitous of plants during this season, the Poinsettia. It is capitalized because it is named after Joel Roberts Poinsett who introduced the plant to the United States in 1828. The Poinsettia is native to Mexico and found wild in the tropical climates down the entire coast of Mexico. The plant became popular during Christmas when the Albert Ecke family began selling their plants in Los Angeles during the early 1900s. In the 1990s, through new grafting techniques, the plants took on their bushy look, thus creating their current popularity. The red color of the plant is created through photoperiodism which means the plant requires 12 hours daily of total darkness five days in a row. The part that turns red are not the flowers but bracts which are actual leaves of the plant. The Ecke family still lives in Southern California and provides 70% of the Poinsettias sold in the United States.
