Although his explorations have taken him from Alaska to Antarctica, the wild lands and parks surrounding Mount Diablo near his home in Concord remain his favorite photo locations. Scott strives to be a naturalist first and a photographer second and believes that the best way to become a better nature photographer is by improving his knowledge of natural history.

Scott's images have appeared in many local, regional, and national publications including *Bay Nature*, *Diablo Magazine*, *California Wild*, *Outdoor California*, and in newspapers ranging from the *San Francisco Chronicle* to the *New York Times*. His images have also been used in several books, including most recently, *Rare Birds of California*, and *Fifty Places to Go Birding Before You Die*. Scott's images are used by a number of non-profit conservation and environmental organizations to support their conservation and land preservation efforts. He currently

serves as President of the Board of Directors of Save Mount Diablo, a land conservation organization based in Walnut Creek. Scott received *Diablo Magazine's* Threads of Hope award in 2007 in recognition of his volunteer efforts supporting land conservation. I hope you will enjoy Scott's presentation as well as some of his insights about Mount Diablo.

The cold weather chilled our fishing activities this month, but just a bit. It has been a banner year for rockfish and ling cod and that continued right up to year's end with two very successful outings.

Carl Moyer, Gordon Linebaugh, and George Vogt journeyed out of Pacifica in **Carl's** boat and returned with a limit of both species as well as some crab caught south of the Golden Gate. Fishing north of the Gate was equally rewarding for **Rich Fiscina** of Branch 146, who hosted **Gene Schulting** of Branch 146 and **Gordon Linebaugh** on his boat and hauled in several meals' worth of rockfish and ling cod.

In the Delta, **Carl Moyer** and **Rich Fiscina** fished for sturgeon but did not land any keepers. But **Rich** and **Joe Miscione** caught a bevy of stripers in Montezuma Slough, which is **Joe's** favorite hunting ground.

Nor did the cold weather nip the fishing at our old standby, Shadow Cliffs Reservoir. **Harry Sherinian** landed the largest trout, with a big rainbow weighing in at seven pounds. A few days later, **Dick Thomson** picked up a big trout while fishing with **Harry** and **Terry Miller**. And then **Gene Schulting** and his son caught a respectable string of trout at the reservoir.

Don Mittelstadt flew to Louisiana to fly fish for redfish and after an epic struggle, landed a fourteen pounder.

Our February and March outings include several trips to Shadow Cliffs and San Pablo Reservoirs for trout, to the Delta for sturgeon, and to Lake Berryessa for trout, bass, and kokanee. You are welcome to join us even if you have never fished or have not fished for a while.

Our next meeting will be on Thursday, January 23rd at the Legends Sports Bar and Grill at the Diablo Creek Golf Course at 4050 Port Chicago Highway in Concord. Don't be in a hurry to cut them back as what is left of the plant still gives them further protection from cold weather. Also don't give up on your plants. Some may surprise you and come back. I have a Lantana that always looks like a goner, but around April it rewards me with green shoots. Hang in there and have faith in Mother Nature.

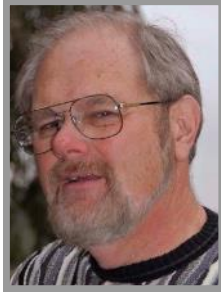
