He also has a nationwide reputation with the law enforcement community for his expertise, as well as his lecturing and training acumen. He graduated from UC Berkeley and earned his law degree from the King Hall School of Law at UC Davis.


We are not meeting in December due to the Christmas holiday but will resume in January hosted by Sir **Garth Cummings.** See you next year.






analysis with some humor has given us some insight into our strengths and weaknesses. Good job **Dick**!
