Couples Duplicate Bridge Lo McCarley


Meet the 3rd Wednesday of each month starting at 7:00 pm at participants' homes. Couples play as partners.

THAT'S GREEK TO ME

The so-called "Mediterranean Diet" has been debated for decades. Does it really prevent heart attacks? If so, is it the olive oil? The red wine? Or something else?

A recent study from Greece sheds some light on all the conjecture. For more than 4 years, some 22,000 healthy Greeks were followed, and it was determined that those who ate the traditional Mediterranean diet were 33% less likely to die of heart disease and 24% less likely to die of cancer. Overall, they had a 25% lower death rate.

What made the difference? Scientists found that their diets consisted primarily of:

- 1. An abundance of plant foods: fruits, vegetables, grains, nuts, and beans.
- 2. Olive oil as the main fat, instead of butter or lard.
- 3. Small to moderate amounts of fish and poultry, but little red meat.
- 4. Moderate consumption of wine.

Perhaps most surprising was that the researchers determined that when only one or two of these were present, there was no significant difference in mortality. Rather, it appears to be a result of the cumulative effect of all of these factors.

Many products on drug store shelves do not carry the USP logo. That means either that the manufacturer did not submit the product for testing or that it did not pass the test.




Song Sirs Chris Satterthwaite


