### **Big Sir's Notes**

After months of discussion the Branch Executive Committee has revised Branch Regulation 3 concerning waiting list policy. As you know the Branch has been

working since last year to reduce the length of its waiting list. A freeze on accepting applicants to the waiting list was put in place earlier in the year pending development of a revised waiting list policy. Under the revised policy the waiting list will be capped at 15 with new additions solicitated when that number is reduced to 5. 

## Health Matters Physical and Mental

### **Wellness Made Easy**

Purple grape juice has some of the same heart benefits as red wine, according to a small study from Boston University School of Medicine. It found that people with heart disease who drank about two cups of Concord grape juice a day for two weeks had an increase in HDL ("good") cholesterol and a decrease in two markers of inflammation. The researchers attribute the benefits to polyphenols in purple grape juice, also found in red wine. (Of course, grape juice lacks alcohol, and alcohol itself, at least in moderation, is know to have heart benefits.) But watch our for calories: a cup of grape juice contains 150 calories, more than most juices.

Don't believe health claims made for noni juice, which comes from the fruit of the morinda plant, consumed by Polynesians and other Pacific people for centuries. Despite the claims in ads and on the Internet, this juice won't cure cancer, multiple sclerosis arthritis or hypertension, nor is it "the most important natural health discovery in decades." All the "evidence" for noni juice comes from testimonials, often from people selling the expensive juice via multilevel marketing program. The FDA and the attorneys general of several states have forced some marketers to stop making health claims for noni. Nevertheless, the claims still proliferate on the Internet and elsewhere.

**Don't eat raw sprouts**, especially if you are in frail health or have an impaired immune system...that's still the advice of the FDA. And don't feed sprouts to young children. This includes not only alfalfa sprouts, but also red clover, wheat, radish, soybean, mung, broccoli, and others, including organic sprouts. The problem: the seeds themselves may be contaminated by *Salmonella* and/or *E. coli* bacteria and the bacteria grows as the sprouts germinate,. Simply washing the sprouts doesn't help. The only way to ensure safety is to cook sprouts thoroughly, but that destroys the most appealing qualities of salads sprout.

If you are taking any prescription drugs, consult your pharmacist or doctor before using antacids. For instance, antacids containing aluminum can reduce the absorption of many drugs, especially when taken within an hour or two of the other drug.


