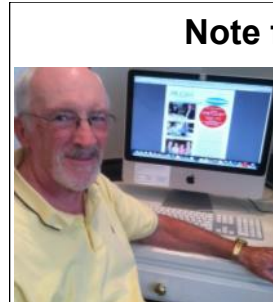

For best results, they need afternoon shade in our area, and sufficient water. Either grow in a container, or trailing varieties for trellises. Of interest, the name nasturtium comes from Latin (NAS) nose and (TORTUM) for twist. This is the reaction one may have by eating one of their bitter-sweet leaves.

He is a published songwriter and the co-writer and composer of numerous music-theatre pieces, which he has directed and performed in New York, Los Angeles, and at festivals in India and Morocco.

In his career as a performer, he has worked on and off Broadway, in film and television. He has performed with the Erick Hawkins Dance Company, portrayed the villainous Pierre LeChance on *The Guiding Light*, was the radio voiceover for New York City Opera, and played guitar and harmonica in many rock, blues, and country-western bands in New York City.

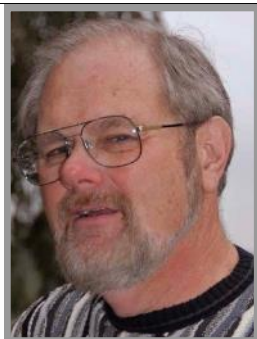

We have been disappointed with the salmon bite so far this year. The ocean has been turgid and the wind has been blowing constantly. But we expect it to pick up. Further, it did not deter some of our members from catching salmon, although they had to go to Alaska to do it. **Harry Sherinian** and **Terry Miller** journeyed to Coffman Cove near Ketchikan and limited out with big salmon every day. In addition, **Dick Thomson** caught a 61 pound halibut on the same trip. **Carl Moyer** did manage to sneak out onto the ocean on a rare mild day and picked up some rockfish and lingcod.

Trout fishing has been somewhat better, mainly at San Pablo Reservoir. **Carl Moyer** and **Gordon Linebaugh** fished from the shore there and caught limits up to four pounds. **Carl** returned on a solo trip and limited out again, but with smaller fish.

**Gordon** also made a repeat trip to San Pablo with his grandson and landed four trout. Shadow Cliffs Reservoir has not produced as well as San Pablo, but **George Schulze** did well there. But he used a borrowed pink reel and lost lots of macho points. **Ron Masick**, **Barry Rauchle**, and **Carl Moyer** used more masculine gear and did not fare as well as



**George**. Our shad expert, **Ernie Wong**, took **Don Mittelstadt** and **Carl Moyer** to the Sacramento River and they landed 60 shad. It was **Carl's** maiden voyage to shad country and he is now hooked.

The Delta continued to produce. **Rich Fiscina** of Branch 146 caught a 45 inch sturgeon, fishing with **Carl Moyer** and **Joe Karg**. **Mike Corker** caught a keeper striper upriver while **Tom Kostik** landed stripers and black bass on several trips. **Raleigh Davis** went out on a party boat seeking salmon in the ocean but the water was so rough that the captain chose to stay in San Francisco Bay. That was okay with **Raleigh** because he caught two nice stripers weighing seven and nine pounds respectively.

Three of our Branch 146 fishermen; **Pete Gates**, **Tom Boltz**, and **Brad Hatcher** teamed up with **Chuck Vanoncini** on a successful outing to Lake Don Pedro. They returned with a cooler full of kokanee, king salmon, and rainbow trout.

We will be very busy this summer with Delta fishing for bass, catfish, and sturgeon; trout in mountain and local lakes; salmon and rockfish from the ocean; and halibut from the bay. We live in a fisherman's paradise.

Our next meeting will be Thursday, July 24th, at the Legend Sports Bar and Grill at the Diablo Creek Golf Course, 4050 Port Chicago Highway in Concord.
