



Joaquin Miller and Dimond Canyon Parks in the Oakland Hills

Our second hike will be on Friday, July 22nd, at Joaquin Miller and Dimond Canyon parks in the Oakland Hills. The tree-shaded trails here (many redwoods) are sometimes just a short distance from busy city streets, yet you will feel miles away. To make this a 5 mile mostly downhill hike, we will meet at the Ranger Station / Community Center at Joaquin Miller at 10 am and hike down to Dimond Park. Bring a lunch or snack to have along the way, or at Dimond if we do not get too hungry!

To reach the park from Hwy 24, take the Hwy 13 South exit, which is just west of the Caldecott Tunnel. Proceed South on Hwy 13 about 3 miles and take the Joaquin Miller Rd exit. Turn left on Joaquin Miller Rd and proceed up the hill about a mile and turn left on Sanborn Drive (watch for a sign for Woodminster Theater). Sanborn drive has two entrances from Joaquin Miller, but only one has an open gate. If you reach the stoplight at Skyline you've gone too far—make a U-turn and go back. The parking lot is just a few hundred feet down Sanborn Drive on the left, just past the "Do Not Enter" sign. If the small lot is full, there is a much larger one a few feet ahead on the left.

Are you asking "When we get to Dimond Park, how do we get back up the hill to our cars?" I would like to ask one or two drivers to volunteer to meet me at Dimond Park at 9:30 am (I will give you directions when you volunteer). I will drive you to the start of the hike, and you will drive me and other drivers back to our cars at the end of the hike. Clear as mud??

So for this hike, I would really appreciate knowing who is planning on coming so I can make sure I can get you back to your car! I know this all sounds like a lot of trouble, but I bet if you decide to come you will really enjoy it. As always anyone wishing to carpool with me, meet at the Stevens exit off Hi-way 24. Let me know and I will give you availability and meeting time and place. The length of this hike is 5.30 mile with an ascent 421 ft. (-1529 ft.). That's right, we will go down about 1500 ft. with a climb near the beginning about 400 ft. up. This hike should take about three hours.


We meet every Monday at 11:30 am at Masse's, 2721

June's Attendance: By my count there were 207 meals served at our June luncheon, 12 more than our guaranteed number and two more than Boundary's commitment. We are




Mexican Train Dominoes Group 1 (UNO) Jerry Kaplan


Our Sunday, June 26th game night was at **Dick** and **Janice Woodman's** home where it was a beautiful evening. Socializing, playing and eating were all great fun




Poker Group 1






