
same way. We will always accommodate a guest, timely advised or not.

The "Floating White House" was originally commissioned the USCG Cutter Electra in 1934. In 1936 it was renamed the USS Potomac and served as Franklin Delano Roosevelt's Presidential Yacht until his death in 1945.

At this time we have 38 people who have made a paid reservation for our SIR 146 Explore & Eat group on the USS Potomac that is scheduled for August 17<sup>th</sup>, 2017. The good news is that there is plenty of room for more sign-ups! This event will start with a slide show presentation of the history of the USS Potomac at 9:45 am at the USS Potomac's office located at 540 Water Street, Oakland (across from the boat dock in Jack London Square). At 10:15 am we will board the USS Potomac and depart at 10:30 am. The 2 hour cruise/tour will return to Jack London Square at 12:30 PM. We will be making arrangement for a lunch spot in the Jack London Square area immediately following the cruise at approximately 1:00 pm.

Since we have 38 signed up, we have secured the group rate spot on the USS Potomac tour and we have the ability to sign up all future reservations (Based on space available) for any additional people who want to go on the cruise at the discounted price. The boat holds 120 people and there are approximately 50 spaces open at this time. There is plenty of convenient parking in a garage one and half blocks from the boat dock and some meter street parking. 






### Book Nook Peter Plante

Our next game will be on July 3<sup>rd</sup> at the home of **Jim Stedman**.






