Health Matters, Physical and Mental



MIRACLE DRUGS?

There's a classification of drugs called "statins" that has been found to lower cholesterol by as much as 60 percent. Trade names include:

Mevacor, Pravachol, Zocor, Lescol and Lipitor.

But the surprising benefits afforded by these drugs have scientists wondering if they are not the closest thing yet to miracle drugs. Preliminary evidence indicates that statins are helpful in preventing colon cancer, increasing bone density and in preventing Alzheimer's.

Colon cancer - Investigators theorize that statins' cholesterol-lowering activity may also protect the body from colon cancer. Statins appear to block biochemical reactions that would normally activate certain proteins needed by cancer cells to survive and grow. Says **Peter Holt**, MD, author of the Columbia University, New York study, "Statins shouldn't be used for colon cancer prevention at this point. But if you need statins for cholesterol, you may get an advantage."

Bone building - A study of 92,000 British men and women found that those who took statins for high cholesterol had half the risk of suffering bone fractures as those who didn't. "I believe that statins have great potential as bone-active agents," says **Greg Mundy**, MD, of the University of Texas where he prescribes statins for osteoporosis prevention.

Alzheimer's - University of Massachusetts researchers found that patients taking certain statins had a 60 to 73 percent lower risk of developing Alzheimer's than those not on statins. Researchers theorize that statins may prevent dementia primarily by dilating tiny blood vessels and improving function in the cells that line them, thereby increasing blood flow to the brain. "We believe that the potential for prevention of dementia is both real and substantial." says study author **David Drachman**, MD.

Tufts University Health and Nutrition Letter (June 2001) isn't ready to call statins miracle drugs...yet. "Evidence behind their potential benefits is still preliminary, and more studies are needed to bring each murky picture into focus. But the connections are certainly intriguing."

My most demanding and dangerous experience was as a night fighter pilot on two carrier tours during the Korean War. We flew all the night missions and night carrier landings are very demanding. My worst experience was getting shot up one night and making a forced landing on a Marine emergency strip. I stood in the hole in the wing. The Marines patched up the hole and I flew the plane back to the carrier. The crew took one look at the wing, disconnected it and threw it over the side! I concluded my Navy career as the Commanding Officer of the 12th Naval District in San Francisco.

I worked for BART for fifteen years to put my seven children through college. I take great pride that my two sons also became Navy pilots (not very common). My older son, David, retired as an EA6B pilot and is now a 747 captain for Northwest Airlines. My younger son **Jim** is still in the Navy Reserves flying as an instructor in the Top Gun squadron in Fallon, Nevada.

Family affairs take up most of my time now, but I enjoyed playing slow-pitch softball with the Walnut Creakers for more than ten years. Tours, traveling, bridge, gardening and woodworking (making small furniture and toys for the little ones) take up the rest of my time. I have enjoyed being a member of SIR since 1990 and meeting many very nice people.
