Lastly, the June luncheon includes a Colorful Shirt Competition with prize.

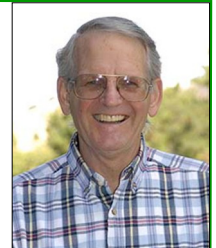

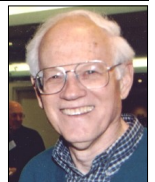

Spread on eight ounces of Cool Whip and sprinkle on the remaining crumbs. Return to the freezer and remove ten minutes before serving.

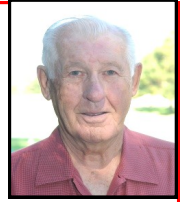

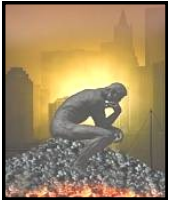

“The Hairy Ape”

Scheduled for September
Theatre Party



An important drama from the 1920's by a prize-winning playwright is the SIR 146 Theatre Party for September. It will be presented at the Village Theatre in Danville on Thursday, September 23rd at 8:00 p.m., produced by the Eugene O'Neill Foundation. Eugene O'Neill's "The Hairy Ape" is an Expressionistic play about a steam-ship stoker who tries to make sense of the world around him. It is a powerful statement about the effects of industrialization and technology on the worker. While set in the 1920s, "The Hairy Ape" is relevant in many ways to contemporary times.

The play is by Nobel Prize winning Playwright **Eugene O'Neill**, who lived at Tao House, his home in the Danville hills, between 1937-1941. Here **O'Neill** wrote his most notable plays, including "A Long Day's Journey Into Night," "A Moon for the Misbegotten," and "The Iceman Cometh." Tao House is now part of the **Eugene O'Neill** National Historic Site, operated by the National Park Service.

Tickets for "The Hairy Ape," in a special group rate for SIR members is \$25. Space is limited. Deadline to order is September 3rd. Tickets will be distributed at the door of the Village Theatre, 233 Front Street, Danville (one block east of Hartz Avenue, near the Danville Library). "The Hairy Ape" is being presented as part of a month-long **Eugene O'Neill** Festival, held each fall in Danville. In addition to the play, several lectures and panels, musical events and art exhibits related to the Expressionistic period will be offered. (Details regarding the Festival will be posted on the Eugene O'Neill Foundation website, www.eugeneoneill.org). Expressionism was a cultural movement of the early 20th century that vividly distorted personal moods and ideas. Other artists working in the mode included **Edward Munch** and **Vincent van Gogh** (art), **Franz Kafka** (literature) and **August Strindberg** (drama).
