You may be surprised to learn that falls are the leading reason seniors lose their independence. However, the good news is that falls are preventable through exercise, medication management, eye exams, and home modifications. Gennifer and Phil will educate and inform us on how to minimize the possibility of falling. It is never too early, or late, to get started on a program of physical fitness.

In **July**, our second topic designed to assist seniors is aimed at alerting us to a number of schemes that are designed to take advantage of seniors, and we need to be alert as to how to guard against becoming a victim of so called "Senior Scams." Our speaker will be **DEBORAH BRAVER**, who is a representative of the State of California Department of Corporations and is located in Sacramento. She specializes in education and outreach to the public with emphasis on the senior segment of the population. She will also provide information as to where we can find resources to assist us should we become a "victim."

Our next game will be hosted by **Bill Rees** on Monday, June 13.



The trout fishing at Shadow Cliffs was spectacular this month. Three times in three days Romano Gnusti, Carl Moyer and Gordon Linebaugh limited out by 9 am with fish up to three pounds.
