Because of the Ladies Day Luncheon, we did not hold a BEC meeting in May and, therefore, no new members were inducted. However, **Art Ainscough** passed





Prize for drama in 1987. A SIR 146 theatre party of *Fences* is scheduled for Wednesday, July 20th at 7:30 pm at the open-air California Shakespeare Theatre in Orinda.

August Wilson's Pulitzer Prize Winning Drama is SIR 146 Theatre Party for July

Fences by August Wilson is a stunning dramatic work that has won critical acclaim. Not only did Fences win the Pulitzer Prize but, also, the 1987 Tony Award for Best Broadway Play, starring James Earl Jones. The Broadway play was later made into a film starring Denzel Washington. The focus is on Troy, a 53-year-old former baseball player in the 1950's, who was unable to break into the Major Leagues in his younger years. He now lives a menial, though respectable life, collecting trash with his wife and son in an Eastern industrial town.

The play centers around a father, his wife and teen-age son, and his brother, and the challenges they face in their lives with the place in society that has been given to them.

August Wilson is one of a handful of America's most prolific and respected playwrights. His productions of *Ma Rainey's Black Bottom, The Piano Lesson* and *Joe Turner's Come and Gone* joined *Fences* in winning critical acclaim. *Fences* is part of Wilson's Century cycle of exploring the evolving African-American experience. The playwright died in 2005.



On June 10th we will be hiking Redwood Regional Park. This is an easy 5 mile out and back hike in the deep redwoods along the Stream trail. Hiking time is about 3 hours. Bring a lunch and water. Trail surface: Wide dirt trail. Exposure:

Shaded in the canyon.

Take hi-way 13 to Redwood Road, turn left and drive about 4 miles to the Redwood Gate and park in the first lot on the left after the Fishway interpretive center. Redwood Regional Park, 7867 Redwood Road.

If you wish to carpool, meet at the turnoff at St Stevens Rd off HI-way 24 at 9:30 am, Turn right and park on El Nino Rd where there is plenty of parking. I have room for two. *Hike starts at 10:00 am*

Please join us Friday June 24th for a nice cool hike through the redwoods of Oakland. We will be hiking the French Trail loop at Redwood Regional Park. This is a 6 mile single track moderate loop hike that hits all the highlights of this well-shaded park nestled in the Oakland hills. This is a peaceful, hidden bowl of coastal redwoods with a creek at the bottom. Notice this hike is rated as moderate so I am allotting four hours with plenty of breaks and a lunch stop. Hiking poles are recommended as the first section is a steep uphill, after that will be a mostly level hike through the redwoods.

Take Hi-way 13 to Redwood Road, turn left and drive about 4 miles to the Redwood Gate and park in the first lot on the left after the Fishway interpretive center. Redwood Regional Park, 7867 Redwood Road.

SongSirs Bruce Borgman






