He worked in the milk division. Four years later, in 1961, he bought a 4 bedroom home in Concord for \$15,700 for himself, wife and 4 children.

After working 28 years, he retired at the age of 58. In June 2000 he and his wife celebrated their 50th wedding anniversary.

He now is on 3 bowling teams and is enjoying life. Norbert enjoys his companionship with the SIRS.
