


The Cribbage Club Tournaments were held on February 13 hosted by **Barney Meade**.

at higher risk for heart disease, such as smokers and those with elevated cholesterol.

SKIN CANCER CREAM

There may soon be a topical cream to treat skin cancer. Originally formulated for genital warts, it is being tested as a treatment for basal cell carcinoma. Traditional treatment includes burning, freezing, scalping or cutting away the affected skin. The cream, imiquimod (Aldara) can be applied to the skin at home and is less likely to cause scarring and change in pigmentation associated with other treatments.

While the drug has not yet been approved for skin cancer treatment, it has shown promise in two studies. In an Australian study of people with early basal cell carcinoma, 90 percent of people who applied it for six weeks reported that the cancer went away. In a U.S. study involving people with superficial basal cell carcinoma, all of those in the study experienced complete healing. Imiquimod induces the cells to produce interferon, a chemical that is part of the body's natural defense system.

Further studies are required before approval by the FDA, however Mayo Clinic doctors are optimistic about possible new uses for this drug.




