SIR Branch 146 History

The first organizational meeting was held on March 28, 1988 at the Pleasant Hill Country Club under the sponsorship of the Las Trampas Branch 116. There were 74 sponsors and guests in attendance and \$106.91 in contributions was raised.

The second meeting was held on April 26, 1988 at which time a slate of officers was appointed and sworn in by the State Vice-President, Russell Agnew. Hugh McCullough became Big Sir and Probationary status was authorized on May 3, 1988 for Pleasant Hill Branch 146.

When Big Sir **Hugh McCullough** moved from the area in November, Thomas O'Day was appointed the Big Sir. The year 1988 ended with a membership of 69 which was still short of the 100 required for the Branch to be chartered.

In February of 1989 Big Sir Thomas O'Day resigned because of poor health and Charles Unfried was appointed the Big Sir.

While membership recruitment continued, Branch activities such as golf, bowling, ham radio, bridge and RV's were organized. John Fontenrose was the first SIR Call editor.

The luncheon meetings continued to be well attended with excellent speakers. The luncheon location was changed to Zio Fraedo's Restaurant in August 1989. Membership finally passed 100 and the Branch was officially chartered at the Christmas luncheon on December 19, 1989.



Health Matters Physical and Mental

WHERE'S THE FAT?

"There's no safe level of trans fat," says the National Institute of Medicine. Trans fats raise the levels of LDL "bad" cholesterol and lower the levels of HDL "good" cholesterol. *Prevention* magazine (April 2003) called it "riskier than cheddar."

Man-made trans fats show up in virtually every kind of prepared foods, including fries, potato chips, cookies, and crackers. Trans fat produces the crunchy texture and lengthens shelf-life.

But trans fat (made from hydrogenating or partially hydrogenating vegetable oils) plays havoc with health. "The more you eat, the higher your risk," says **Alice Lichtenstein**, DSc, from Tufts University in Boston.

The FDA will soon require labels disclosing the presence of trans fats on all packaged goods, along with a statement advising you to minimize intake.

Note that some foods such as milk, lean meat and poultry contain trans fats, but natural trans fats (not made from hydrogenation) are not harmful to your health, according to **Eric Rimm**, ScD, from the Harvard School of Public Health.

So, what can you do to minimize your exposure to trans fats? Answer.. read labels. You can find varieties of potato chips, cookies, crackers, granola bars, waffles, bagels and whole grain breads and cereals that have no trans fats.

DIET SODAS ARE SAFE

A study of more than 10 year's worth of data by Europe's Scientific Community on Food found no link between consumption of Aspartame (the artificial sweetener most often used in soft drinks and sold as Equal) and cancer or other possible side effects.

CORRECTING COLOR BLINDNESS

There is now a contact lens that can boost color contrast, helping persons with hereditary color-blindness to distinguish between colors-particularly reds and greens-that would normally look the same.

The red-tinted soft contact is worn over just one eye.

NOT TOO LATE FOR EXERCISE

Think you're too old to start an exercise regimen? Not so! A recent Michigan study found that previously sedentary people aged 80-92 who walked on a treadmill or rode an exercise bike for an average of 230 minutes twice a week for six months significantly improved their cardiovascular fitness levels.

More exercise resulted in more improvement.
