

Steve will speak at our April meeting.


Garden tip of the month: Although we have had some warm days, the soil heats up slowly. A soil thermometer is the most accurate way to take your soil's temperature. Plant when the soil reaches your crops ideal temperature. My soil temperature has been around 45 degrees. Most veggies won't do any thing until the soil temperature is at least 55 degrees. To get a jump star, your best bet is to start your seeds indoors and then transplant them to a larger container and then to the garden when the soil temperature is right for your plant.


