Our Audit Committee, Ron de Golia and Joe Fuchs, presented the Audit

Report for calendar year 2008 to the BEC. They did an outstanding job with the audit and their recommendations for improving Branch operations and financial health.

They recommend, and the BEC agrees, that we move from a cash based operation to a check based operation. We will pay for the luncheon with a check instead of cash. This will save the Treasurer and the luncheon vendor the time that is spent counting and recounting cash. They only need to agree on the head count.

The BEC requests that our members pay by check to ease the time consuming tasks of making change and counting cash which has been an unnecessary burden on our treasurer and the check-in volunteers. Often they are late for lunch. You benefit by being able to prepare your check ahead of time and the lines will move much faster. Cash will still be accepted.

Another recommendation that is being studied by the BEC is a recommendation to increase our cash balance. We entered 2008 with a comfortable cash balance, however the Branch made some investments: a piano, projector and computer for Power Point presentations at our lunches and for our computer classes.

In March we will likely request a voluntary contribution to restore our cash balance to a comfortable level.
